

## Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 –

### Men's Downhill Courchevel stat sheet

#### Previous Downhill race stats – Garmisch-Partenkirchen

- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** won the seventh race of the Audi FIS World Cup Downhill season in Garmisch-Partenkirchen (GER) on 28 February. It was his fourth World Cup Downhill win of the season. **Alexis Monney (SUI/Stoeckli)** finished 2nd for his first first Downhill podium of the season. **Stefan Rogentin (SUI/Fischer)** was 3rd, earning his first top-three World Cup finish in any discipline this season.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** is leading the 2025/26 World Cup Downhill standings after seven events with 610 points. **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** is 2nd with 435, **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** is in 3rd place with 325.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** and **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** are the only two athletes who have managed to claim more than one Downhill World Cup win during the 2024/25 and 2025/26 seasons. Odermatt has six, von Allmen four.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has finished inside the top 10 in each of his past 17 World Cup races across all disciplines. He has claimed seven wins and a total of 11 podium finishes during that streak.
- **Marco Odermatt's (SUI/Stoeckli)** has also never finished out of the top 4 in the past nine World Cup races across all disciplines he started. 4th place in Crans Montana was his worst finish of the Downhill season so far. Apart from that he has four wins (Beaver Creek, the first Val Gardena Downhill, Wengen and Garmisch-Partenkirchen) and two runners-up spots (second at Val Gardena Downhill and Kitzbuehel).
- It's been almost three seasons since **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** finished outside the top seven in a World Cup Downhill race – he came 15th in the 2022/23 World Cup Finals in Soldeu.
- **Alexis Monney (Stoeckli)** and **Stefan Rogentin (Fischer)** both claimed their first Downhill podium finishes of the season to bring Switzerland its first podium sweep of the season. The last time a nation other than Switzerland managed a Downhill podium sweep was Austria in Garmisch-Partenkirchen 2014/15, when **Hannes Reichelt** won ahead of **Romed Baumann (now GER/Salomon)** in 2nd and **Matthias Mayer** in 3rd.
- Italian athletes didn't manage to step on the podium in Garmisch-Partenkirchen and stopped one step shy of their all-time longest streak of consecutive World Cup Downhill podium finishes at 5 races in a row. **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** was 3rd in the first race of the Val Gardena doubleheader and 2nd in Crans Montana; **Florian Schieder (ITA/Atomic)** was 3rd in the second Val Gardena Downhill; and **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** claimed 3rd in Wengen and a win in Kitzbuehel.

### Courchevel Downhill stats

- A top 10 for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** in Courchevel would guarantee him his 3rd consecutive Downhill Crystal Globe.
- **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** is the only skier who can still upset **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** in the Downhill Globe race, so another way for Odermatt to guarantee the top spot in the DH standings would be to claim 26 points more in Courchevel.
- A win for **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** and a place outside the top 10 for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** in Courchevel would mean that the Downhill title will be decided in the season finale in Kvitfjell.
- The Overall Globe can be decided during the Courchevel weekend. Only **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** can clinch the title in Courchevel, while **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic, trailing 572 points)** and **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head, 686)** are the only two skiers who still have chances to beat Odermatt. The Swiss skier needs to score 128 points more than any of them in two SG and one DH races to become unreachable. Pinheiro Braathen will be starting only in SG, McGrath will not be starting this speed weekend. Odermatt can win the Overall Crystal Globe on Friday, as he only needs 29 points on Braathen, who is not competing in the Downhill.
- Courchevel has hosted a World Cup Downhill only once before in March 2022 (beside the World Championships in 2023), when **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head)** triumphed ahead of **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** in 2nd and **Beat Feuz (SUI)** in 3rd.
- A single win for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** during the Courchevel weekend would see him take the third place on his own the men's all-time World Cup winners list across all disciplines. After Kranjska Gora, Odermatt has 54 World Cup wins, on par with **Hermann Maier (AUT)** and 32 behind **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** who leads the men's field with 86 wins.
- If **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** finishes on the podium in two out of three Courchevel races, he will take the third spot on the list of the most men's World Cup podiums across all disciplines. Odermat currently has 101 career podium finishes, one behind **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)**. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** has the most career podiums - 155.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI)** has claimed four Downhill World Cup wins this season, which is a career best result for him. Another win will allow him to become the second Swiss skier to achieve five Downhill wins in one season since **Pirmin Zurbriggen** in 1986/87.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has claimed a podium spot in six out of seven races this season. The only non-podium race for him was Crans Montana, where he finished 4th. If Odermatt manages another two podium finishes in two remaining races, he'll repeat **Franz Klammer's (AUT)** record of eight podiums in nine races in 1974/75. All

eight podiums were wins for Klammer though. **Jean Claude Killy (FRA)** achieved a perfect season in 1966/67 winning all races, but there were only five of them that year.

- A win in Courchevel for **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** would see the Italian claim 2nd place on his own in the all-time men's Downhill World Cup winners list. Currently Paris – whose most recent win came in Kvitfjell in March 2025 – sits alongside **Peter Müller (SUI)** with 19 World Cup victories. **Franz Klammer (AUT)** is out in front with 25 wins.
- If **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** claims a podium finish in Courchevel he'll occupy 6th place on his own in the all-time men's Downhill World Cup top-3 finishes list, with 35 podiums. Currently he has an equal number of podium finishes with **Franz Heinzer (SUI)**. **Beat Feuz (SUI)** tops this list with 47.
- **Dominik Paris (ITA/Nordica)** is chasing an 11th consecutive World Cup Downhill top-10 finish. If he manages to continue his streak, which started in Crans Montana in February 2025, he'll repeat his record streak of 11 top-10 finishes during the 2020/21 – 2021/22 seasons.
- **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** has scored points in his past 16 consecutive Downhill World Cup races. This is a career best streak and the second longest current streak among all active athletes. Only **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has more; 25 consecutive points-scoring races. These are career-best streaks for both skiers.
- **Giovanni Franzoni (ITA/Rossignol)** has the opportunity to continue to challenge the dominant Swiss speed duo. Franzoni (one World Cup Downhill win and one Super G win) is the only skier other than **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** to record a World Cup win in both speed disciplines this season. Franzoni has one Downhill win compared to four for Odermatt and two for **Franjo von Allmen's (SUI/Head)**. Franzoni started the season having never won a World Cup race.
- If an Austrian athlete fails to win in Courchevel, this will be team Austria's 24th consecutive Downhill World Cup race without a win. This streak is the all-time longest for Austria, beating the 22-race streak that occurred during the 1985/86 – 1988/89 seasons. **Vincent Kriechmayr (Head)** was the last Austrian to win a Downhill race, triumphing in Soldeu in March 2023.
- If a Swiss athlete steps on to the podium in Courchevel, this will be team Switzerland's 22nd consecutive Downhill World Cup podium - the longest streak for the team and second all-time longest, matching Austria's streak from 1975/76-1977/78. The longest ever streak of 33 consecutive Downhill World Cup podiums also belongs to team Austria (2002/03-2005/06).
- The last French athlete to win a World Cup Downhill race in France was **Pierre-Emmanuel Dalcin** in 2006/07 in Val d'Isere. This was also the last French World Cup Downhill podium finish on the home slopes.

- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has the chance to claim his 10th consecutive top-five finish in a World Cup Downhill race. This streak dates back to the 2024/25 race in Crans Montana in February 2025 and is the longest streak of his career.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** is also going for his 23rd consecutive World Cup Downhill top-10 finish. He is already on the second longest all-time streak. **Beat Feuz (SUI)** holds the longest streak of all, 36.
- **Adrien Théaux (FRA / Salomon)** announced last week the end of his career. In his farewell race, he brings to a close a career that includes 334 World Cup starts, 13 podiums with 3 victories, a Super-G bronze medal at the 2015 World Championships in Beaver Creek, and 8 Olympic starts.
