

## FACTS & FIGURES – Men's Slalom, Alta Badia

• Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/ Van Deer), the slalom Crystal Globe winner in 2016, 2020 and 2022, is currently leading the Slalom standings, after finishing second in Levi, sixth in Gurgl and winning in Val d'Isère on December 15.

• Kristoffersen currently also tops the Giant Slalom and Overall standings.

• Kristoffersen has never won a Slalom at Alta Badia. He has won the GS twice here, in December 2021 and December 2019.

• Clement Noël (FRA/ Dynastar) is second in the men's Slalom standings. He won the two opening Audi FIS World Cup Slalom races of the season – in Levi on November 17, and in Gurgl on November 24.

• He did not start the Slalom in Val d'Isère after sustaining an injury during the Giant Slalom.

• Noël has never been on a podium at Alta Badia.

• Among skiers representing France (including women), only Perrine Pelen (15) and Jean Noël Augert (13) have claimed more World Cup victories in the slalom as Noël (12).

• **Manuel Feller (AUT/ Atomic)** Reigning Slalom Crystal Globe champion Feller won four of the 10 World Cup Slaloms last season, finishing inside the top five in the other six races. Feller started the Slalom season with two DNFs in Levi and Gurgl.

• Feller finished joint fourth with Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/ Atomic) in the Slalom in Val d'Isère.

• Feller secured five podium finishes last season – four first-place finishes and one second-place finish.

• Feller's best result at Alta Badia was second in the Slalom in December 2020.

• Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/ Atomic) made his slalom debut for Brazil, his mother's home country, in Levi, finishing fourth.

• In the GS at Beaver Creek on 8 December 2024, he made history by finishing second – becoming the first Brazilian athlete to reach a World Cup podium in alpine skiing.

• Braathen was Slalom Crystal Globe winner in 2022-23, skiing for Norway.

• Braathen is currently sixth in the Slalom standings.

• Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/ Head) is fourth in the Slalom standings, after finishing second in Val d'Isère and third in Gurgl.

• Feller's best result at Alta Badia was second in the Giant Slalom in December 2020.

• Loic Meillard (SUI/ Rossignol), fourth in the Slalom standings last season, was unable to start the season in Sölden after injuring his back.

• Meillard secured third place in Levi, fifth in Gurgl, and third in Val d'Isère to lie third in the standings.

• Linus Strasser (GER/ Rossignol) Two victories and three podium places helped Linus to his best ever finish of second in last season's slalom standings.

• Strasser started this Slalom season with a 36<sup>th</sup> place, a DNQ and a DNF.

• **Kristoffer Jakobsen (SWE/ Fischer)** is fifth in the slalom standings. He got his fourth career podium in Gurgl, finishing in second place.

• Steven Amiez (FRA/ Rossignol), was in third position after the first run in Levi but finished sixth by the end of the day. He was in first place after run one at Val d'Isère but DNFed the second run.

• His father, Sébastien Amiez, achieved 10 Slalom World Cup podiums during his career, with his first in 1995 and his last in 2001.
