

## Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Women's Downhill St. Moritz stat sheet 2024/25 & General Downhill stats

- **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** won the Downhill globe and Overall title in 2024/25, posting two DH victories among 10 race wins. **Brignone** is the sixth women's skier to achieve at least 10 wins across all individual events in a season.
- Emma Aicher (GER/Head) was age 21 when she won the Downhill race in Kvitfjell last season, which made her the youngest women's DH race winner since her compatriot Gina Stechert (GER) won the DH in Tarvisio in 2008/09 at several weeks younger.
- In the past three seasons, 18 of the 22 women's DH races have been won by skiers over the age of 30. Of the 10 skiers who combined to win those 22 races, only three were under 30 Marta Bassino (ITA/Head), Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic) and Emma Aicher (GER/Head).
- For the three skiers who finished on the women's Downhill podium at the 2025 World Championships – Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic), Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic) and Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle) - it was each skier's first world championship medal in any event. The last time this happened at the world championships for all three DH podium skiers was at the 1993 World Championships.
- **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** is the all-time leader among women and men for World Cup Downhill wins (43) and podiums (66). **Vonn** has more World Cup DH wins than all of the other starters this weekend in **St. Moritz** combined.

## St. Moritz stats

- **St. Moritz** first hosted a women's World Cup race in 1971/72 and then again in 1972/73, but would not host another until 1999. Since then, **St. Moritz** has hosted a race in most seasons, for a grand total of 54 women's World Cup races. Nineteen of those races were Downhill, with **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** winning the most recent DH in 2023/24.
- The last time a Swiss skier won a women's race in St. Moritz was in 2021/22 when Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head) won the Super G. Gut-Behrami also finished second in the most recent women's race held in St. Moritz, a Super G in 2024/25, behind Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head). Corinne Suter (SUI/Head) is the most recent Swiss woman to make a DH podium in St. Moritz a third in 2022/23.
- Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic) has won 19 World Cup Downhill races. If she wins a Downhill this
  week, she will become the fourth woman to win at least 20 World Cup DHs, joining Lindsey
  Vonn (USA/Head, 43), Annemarie Moser-Proell (AUT, 36) and Renate Goetschl (AUT, 24).



- Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head) will make her 409th World Cup start in all disciplines on Friday, equaling the women's record held by Renate Goetschl (AUT). Both will have exactly 125 Downhill starts and 106 Super G starts as part of their 409 total starts. Vonn is set to break the women's record with her 410th World Cup start in Saturday's second Downhill.
- Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head) made her return from retirement in 2024/25 in the Super G race in St. Moritz. Vonn has contested five Downhill races since then, with a best result of sixth in St. Anton in January this year. Vonn ended the 2024/25 season with a second place in SG in Sun Valley, marking her first World Cup podium since a second-place SG finish in Are in 2017/18. Vonn's last DH podium was a victory in Are the previous day in 2017/18. A win in any race this season would make Vonn the oldest skier to win a World Cup race.
- Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head) is currently equal third for all-time women's and men's World Cup podiums (138), alongside Marcel Hirscher (NED/Van Deer) and behind Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic) on 160 and Ingemar Stenmark (SWE) on 155. For World Cup wins, Vonn is outright third on 82, behind Shiffrin on 104 and Stenmark on 86.
- If Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head) makes two podiums this weekend, she will move from fifth
  (18) to equal-fourth (20) for all-time Austrian women's downhill World Cup podiums,
  alongside Wiltrud Drexel (AUT). At least one DH victory would see Huetter become the 11<sup>th</sup>
  Austrian women's skier to record double figure World Cup wins across all disciplines. Huetter
  is currently on nine wins alongside Kathrin Zettel (AUT).
- If Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic) makes two podiums this weekend, she will become the fifth
  USA women's skier to achieve double figure Downhill World Cup podiums. Johnson is
  currently on eight career DH podiums, one ahead of Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic).
- If **Valerie Grenier (CAN/Rossignol)** makes the podium, she will move from equal 9<sup>th</sup> to equal 7<sup>th</sup> for all-time Canadian women's World Cup podiums. **Grenier** has one downhill podium, a third in **Cortina D'Ampezzo** in 2023/24.
- If **USA** skiers win two races this weekend, the **USA** will become the third nation (after **Austria** and **Switzerland**) to record 400 women's and men's World Cup wins.
- Italy and France both have 336 women's and men's World Cup wins entering this week's races, equal fourth among all national ski associations. The next Italian or French victory would see that nation move into outright fourth, behind Austria, Switzerland and the USA.
- Italy has 41 women's World Cup Downhill victories coming into this week's races. A double victory in St. Moritz would see Italy join Germany in equal fourth on 43, behind Austria (126), Switzerland (99), USA (71) and Germany (43).
- Swiss skiers have won 99 women's World Cup Downhill races. With a win in either of the two DH races this weekend, Switzerland will join Austria (126) as the only two nations to have won at least 100.



• France and Germany both have 124 women's DH podiums entering this week's races, equal fourth among all national ski associations. The next French or German DH podium would see that nation move into outright fourth, behind Austria, Switzerland and the USA.
