

FACTS & FIGURES – Women’s Downhill World Championships, Saalbach

- **Women’s Downhill World Championship gold medals by nation:** Austria (13 golds), Switzerland (11), Germany (6), Canada (4), Slovenia (3), USA (3), Great Britain (2), France (2), Sweden (1), Italy (1) and Croatia (1).
- There has only been one women’s World Cup race meeting at Saalbach, Austria, since 2002, which was held last season in preparation for these World Championships.
- **Conny Hütter (AUT/Head)** won the Downhill at that meeting in March 2024, with **Ilka Stuhec (SLO/Kaestle)** second and **Nicol Delago (ITA/Atomic)** third.
- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** has won two World Championship medals – silver in the Super G at Åre 2019, and bronze in the GS at St. Moritz 2017.
- Goggia has won 19 career World Cup Downhill races and Olympic Winter Games Downhill gold at PyeongChang 2018.
- In her last 17 World Cup Downhill races dating back to December 2022, Goggia has 15 podiums (seven wins, six seconds and two thirds), one fourth, and two DNFs.
- She was second in the most recent women’s Downhill World Cup, at Garmisch.
- **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** won the Super G at Garmisch in January, her first World Cup win on tour this season.
- Gut-Behrami has eight career World Championship medals, including two golds – both won at Cortina 2021, in the Super G and GS.
- Her best World Championship finish in a Downhill was silver at Val d’Isère 2009. She got Downhill bronze at Cortina d’Ampezzo 2021 and Beaver Creek 2015.
- **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** has won three World Championships medals: gold in the Combined at Courchevel Méribel 2023, silver in the GS at Garmisch-Partenkirchen 2011, and silver in the GS at Courchevel Méribel 2023.
- Brignone finished second in the Super G last season at Saalbach.
- She does not have a World Championship or Olympic Winter Games medal in Downhill.
- Brignone won the most recent women’s Downhill race, at Garmisch in January. She also won the Downhill at St Anton this season. They are the only two Downhill wins of her career.
- She has won five World Cup races in all disciplines this season, the third time in her career she has reached this total. She previously achieved five or more wins in 2019/20 (5) and 2023/24 (6).
- **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** has eight career World Championship medals. She has won two gold medals – in the Downhill and the Super G at Val d’Isère 2009.
- Vonn also won World Championship silver twice (Åre 2007 and Garmisch-Partenkirchen 2011) and Downhill bronze twice (St Moritz 2017 and Åre 2019).
- She has never competed at a major race in Saalbach.
- **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)** has five World Championship medals. Her one gold came in the Downhill at Cortina d’Ampezzo 2021.
- Suter was third in the women’s Downhill at the last World Championships, Courchevel Méribel 2023.
- Suter is the defending Olympic Winter Games Downhill champion after winning gold at Beijing 2022.
- **Jasmine Flury (SUI/Kaestle)** won the women’s Downhill at the last World Championships, Courchevel Méribel 2023. It was Flury’s only World Championship medal.
- Flury has won two career World Cup races – a Super G in St Moritz in December 2017, and a Downhill at Val d’Isère in 2023.

- **Conny Hütter (AUT/Head)** won the only women's Downhill that has been contested in Saalbach since 2002, in March 2024.
- Hütter won the first Downhill race of this season, in Beaver Creek.
- She has one World Championship medal – bronze in the Super G at Courchevel Méribel 2023.
- She won the Downhill Crystal Globe last season.

- **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** was third in the Super G last season at Saalbach.
- She came second in the third Downhill race of the season, in Cortina d'Ampezzo.
