

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Men's Giant Slalom Hafjell stat sheet

Previous GS race (Kranjska Gora) stats

- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** won the most recent World Cup Giant Slalom in Kranjska Gora on March 7th, finishing ahead of **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** in 2nd and **Stefan Brennsteiner (AUT/Fischer)** in 3rd.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** became Brazil's first ever Olympic Winter Games gold medallist and earned the nation's maiden World Cup win in Slalom earlier this season. In Kranjska Gora Pinheiro Braathen brought Brazil its first win in Giant Slalom, after finishing 2nd in three consecutive Giant Slalom races before.
- Brazil became the third nation to claim a Giant Slalom World Cup win this season. Before Kranjska Gora only Switzerland (three wins for **Marco Odermatt (Stoekli)** and two for **Loic Meillard (Rossignol)** and Austria (one win for **Marco Schwarz (Atomic)** and **Stefan Brennsteiner (Fischer)** each) managed to win.
- The win in Kranjska Gora was third for **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** in Giant Slalom and seventh Alpine World Cup overall, with four more wins earned in Slalom.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoekli)** has the lead in the Giant Slalom World Cup after eight events with 495 points. **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** is in second with 447 points. **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** is third on 406.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** is currently second in both the Giant Slalom and the Overall World Cup standings behind **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoekli)**. Pinheiro Braathen has finished inside the top-10 of every Slalom (1st, 2nd, 3rd, four times 4th, 5th, 10th and a DNF) and every Giant Slalom (1st, three times 2nd, 5th, 7th, 10th and a DNF) race he has managed to finish during the 2025/26 season.
- **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** has claimed 3rd podium of the season in Kranjska Gora, the previous two top-3 finishes were a win for him.
- **Stefan Brennsteiner (AUT/Fischer)** claimed his third career Giant Slalom World Cup podium this season in Kranjska Gora, including one win. During his previous career, which started in 2012/13, he managed only four top-3 results with no wins.
- **Anton Grammel (GER/Head)** recorded the best Alpine World Cup result in his career by finishing 8th in Kranjska Gora. He was 10th three times before, all in Giant Slalom events.

Hafjell stats

- A podium finish for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** in Hafjell would guarantee him his 5th consecutive Giant Slalom Crystal Globe.
- If **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** finishes off the podium, he can still secure the Giant Slalom Globe provided he does not lose more than 47 points to **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** and 88 points more than **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** who are the only other athletes still contesting the Globe.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** needs to score 49 points more than **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** to clinch the Globe, provided **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** scores no more than 42 points more than him.
- **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)** can claim the Globe only if he wins, **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** finishes off the podium and **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** finishes outside of the top 15.
- This is the first time the Giant Slalom Globe is decided in the season finale since 2020/21 when **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** was 25 points ahead of **Alexis Pinturault (FRA/Head)** before the final race. Pinturault managed to win the race in Lenzerheide (SUI) and clinch the Globe, while Odermatt was 11th.
- If **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** manages to claim the Giant Slalom Crystal Globe, it will be his 4th Globe of the season. He also claimed four Globes in the previous two seasons, so he could become the first man to claim four Globes in one season three times in a row. **Hermann Maier (AUT)** did it twice in 1999/00 and 2000/01.
- A single win for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** during the Norwegian season finale would see him take the third place on his own the men's all-time World Cup winners list across all disciplines. Odermatt now has 54 World Cup wins, on par with **Hermann Maier (AUT)** and 32 behind **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** who leads the men's field with 86 wins.
- A single win during the Norwegian season finale would allow **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** to join **Vreni Schneider (SUI)** in 6th place on the all-time World Cup winners list across all disciplines, men or women. Currently, Odermatt has 54 World Cup wins, one behind Schneider and 54 behind **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA/Atomic)** who leads the field with 108 wins.
- A podium for **Marco Odermatt (Stoeckli)** in Hafjell would be the 47th of his career in GS, seeing him take the undisputed top spot on the list of the most career Giant Slalom World Cup podiums among Swiss athletes, men or women, in history. Currently he is equal with **Michael von Gruenigen** and **Vreni Schneider** with 46 podiums each.

- A podium for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** would see him take undisputed 3rd place on the list of the all-time Giant Slalom World Cup men's podiums with 47. Odermatt is now equal with **Michael von Gruenigen (SUI)** with 46. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the list with 72 career top 3 finishes. **Marcel Hirscher (NED/Van Deer)** is 2nd with 59.
- During the season finale **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** and **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** will decide who will finish the season in 3rd place on the men's all-time list of career Alpine World Cup podiums. Currently they are both on 102, but Kristoffersen will take two starts in SL and GS, while Odermatt will start only in GS. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the list with 155 career top-3 finishes.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** is looking to extend his streak of four consecutive Giant Slalom World Cup podium finishes. He is the only athlete to claim more than two top-3 Giant Slalom finishes in a row during the current season. No nation has more than three consecutive Giant Slalom podiums this season (Norway from Soelden till Beaver Creek).
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** is looking to extend his streak of seven consecutive Giant Slalom World Cup top-10 finishes. This is the longest current streak in the field.
- A win for **Loic Meillard (Rossignol)** in Hafjell would see him join **Pirmin Zurbriggen** in 3rd place for the most Giant Slalom World Cup wins among Swiss athletes with seven each. **Marco Odermatt (Stoeckli)** leads this list with 29 wins.
- **Zan Kranjec (SLO/Rossignol)** is looking to continue his point-scoring streak of 17 consecutive Giant Slalom World Cup races, which is the longest active one in the field. Kranjec has a longer personal streak of 26 point-scoring races during the 2017/18–2020/21 seasons.
- Norwegian athletes have won a Giant Slalom World Cup at home only once. It happened in 1992/93 in Oppdal, when **Kjetil Andre Aamodt** finished ahead of **Johan Wallner (SWE)** in 2nd and **Fredrik Nyberg (SWE)** in 3rd.
- Team Norway has claimed no Giant Slalom World Cup victories this season. In 2024/25 they had three, **Alexander Steen Olsen (Rossignol)** winning in Soelden and Schladming and **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** - in Kranjska Gora.
