

FACTS & FIGURES – Women's Super G Garmisch-Partenkirchen

- Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol) can win her 12th World Cup Super G race to equal Carole Merle (FRA) in fifth place on the all-time women's list.
- Brignone was on the podium in the last two World Cup Super G races (winner in Cortina and third in St. Anton) and she can reach three straight Super G podiums for the first time in her career.
- Brignone won the last Garmisch Super G, in January 2022, in a tie with Conny Hütter (AUT/Head). In Brignone's other eight previous Super Gs in Garmisch from 2009-21, she never made the podium but was in the top 10 six times.

If Brignone doesn't win Saturday's Downhill:

- Brignone has won four World Cup races in all disciplines this season and can win five World Cup races in a single season for the third time in her career. She previously achieved five or more wins in 2019/20 (5) and 2023/24 (6).
- Brignone can win her 32nd World Cup race in all disciplines, which would move her into outright 11th place on the women's all-time list, one win behind Hanni Wenzel (LIE, 33) in 10th.
- Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head) can win her fifth World Cup Super G race in Garmisch. It is already her venue with the most Super G wins.
- In her last 11 World Cup Super G races, Gut-Behrami has finished seventh or better every time, with eight podiums (including three victories).

If Gut-Behrami doesn't win Saturday's Downhill:

- Gut-Behrami can win her 46th World Cup race to equal Renate Götschl (AUT) in fifth place on the all-time women's list.
- Gut-Behrami is yet to win on the World Cup tour this season. In the last 12 seasons prior to this one, starting in 2012/13, she has won at least one race in every season except one (2018/19).
- Her last four Super G podiums have been second-place finishes.
- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** has won seven World Cup Super G race and can equal Hilde Gerg (GER) in equal eighth place on the all-time women's list with her eighth victory.
- If Goggia reaches the podium on both Saturday and Sunday, she will reach 60
 World Cup podiums in her career and move into 20th place on the all-time
 women's list.

If Goggia doesn't win Saturday's Downhill:

- Goggia can win her first World Cup race in Garmisch. She has four career podiums in Garmisch (three Downhill, one Super G) prior to this weekend – all runner-up finishes in 2018 and 2019.
- Goggia has won 26 World Cup races in all disciplines and can equal Maria Höfl-Riesch (GER) in 15th place on the all-time women's list with 27 victories.

- Conny Hütter (AUT/Head) won the Super G in Garmisch in 2022 (tied with Brignone) and can win multiple Super G races in one resort for the first time. Her five World Cup Super G wins to date have come in five different resorts.
- Corinne Suter (SUI/Head) can reach her second World Cup Super G podium in Garmisch after her victory in 2020. Lake Louise is the only other resort where she has made two Super G podiums.
- Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head) has won three of her six World Cup Super G races in Garmisch (in 2009, 2010 and 2015).
- The only other skier from Vonn's 2009 victory in Garmisch who is still active is Brignone, who came 34th in that race as an 18-year-old in her third World Cup start and first in Super G.
