

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Men's Super G Wengen stat sheet

Previous SG race stats – Livigno

- **Marco Schwarz (AUT/Atomic)** won the fourth race of the Audi FIS World Cup Super G season in Livigno (ITA) on 27 December, ahead of **Alexis Monney (SUI/Stoeckli)** in 2nd and **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** in 3rd. The first time that any of them have appeared on a Super G podium this season.
- **Marco Schwarz (AUT/Atomic)** claimed two wins in December – in the Alta Badia (ITA) Giant Slalom and the Livigno (ITA) Super G – his first World Cup victories since his season-ending right knee injury in December 2023.
- **Marco Schwarz (AUT/Atomic)** is only the third male skier to have won more than once this World Cup season, with Paco Rassat (FRA/Head) having won two Slaloms and **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** three Giant Slaloms, two Downhills and a Super G.
- The win in Livigno (ITA) was all-rounder **Marco Schwarz's (AUT/Atomic)** first career Super G World Cup victory, in just his 12th start. He has also won 14 Slalom, seven Giant Slalom and two Alpine Combined World Cup races.
- 2nd place in Livigno (ITA) was the third World Cup Super G podium for **Alexis Monney (SUI/Stoeckli)** who is still chasing his first win in the discipline. He does have a World Cup Downhill win to his name, having triumphed in Bormio in 2024/25.
- After failing to reach the podium in his first three World Cup speed races this season, reigning Downhill world champion **Franjo von Allmen (SUI/Head)** has now won once (second of two Val Gardena Downhills) come second once (first of two Val Gardena Downhills) and third once (in the Livigno Super G) in his past four races.
- Only two athletes have finished inside the top 10 of every World Cup Super G race this season; **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** and **Stefan Rogentin (SUI/Fischer)**.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has finished inside the top 5 in each of the last eight World Cup Super G races. It's his second longest career streak. Odermatt holds the all-time longest streak of 19 consecutive World Cup Super G top-5 finishes.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** has finished inside the top 10 of the last 10 consecutive World Cup races he took part in across all disciplines. He has claimed four wins and a total of eight podium finishes during that streak.
- The reigning three-time World Cup Super G champion **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** leads this season's standings with 275 points, ahead of **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head, 209)** in 2nd and **Raphael Haaser (AUT/Atomic, 146)** in 3rd.

Wengen Super G stats

- Wengen will host a men's World Cup Super G race for just the fifth time. The first race in the famous Swiss resort took place during the 1993/94 season, and, after a 28-year gap, World Cup Super Gs have been held every season since 2021/22.
- Swiss athletes have featured on every Wengen Super G podium except for that very first race in 1993/94, when **Marc Girardelli (LUX)** won ahead of **Jan Einar Thorsen (NOR)** in 2nd and **Atle Skaardal (NOR)** in 3rd.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stoeckli)** and **Aleksander Aamodt Kilde (NOR/Atomic)** have the best records in the Wengen Super G: both have won once, finished runner-up once and had one 3rd place finish. **Odermatt** won in 2021/22, **Kilde** in 2022/23.
- If **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head)** takes part in the Wengen Super G it will be his 232nd World Cup start across all disciplines. That will put him 10th-equal in the all-time list of Austrian men's skiers, alongside **Stephan Eberharter**.
- A podium finish for **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/Head)** would see him claim 5th place on his own in the all-time World Cup Super G men's podiums list. Currently, Kriechmayr has 24 World Cup Super G podiums, level with **Stephan Eberharter (AUT)** and **Aleksander Aamodt Kilde (NOR/Atomic)**.
- If **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** wins in Wengen, a 17th career World Cup Super G victory, he will join **Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR)** and **Renate Götschl (AUT)** in 4th place on the all-time list of World Cup Super G wins, men and women. **Lindsey Vonn (USA,Head)** currently leads this list with 28 Super G victories.
- A win for **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** would also see him join **Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR)** in 2nd place on the men's all-time World Cup Super G winners list. Currently, Odermatt has 16 Super G World Cup wins, one behind Svindal and eight behind **Hermann Maier (AUT)** who leads the men's field with 24 wins.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** currently has 27 World Cup Super G podiums, he needs another three to catch **Aksel Lund Svindal (NOR, 30)** in the 2nd place on the men's all-time list. **Hermann Maier (AUT, 38)** leads this list.
- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/Stöckli)** has the opportunity to stretch his record streak of men's top-10 World Cup Super G finishes. The Swiss skier has finished inside the top 10 in his last 28 World Cup Super G races dating back to the race in Courchevel Meribel in March 2022. In that time he has claimed 12 wins and 20 podium finishes.
- **Romed Baumann (GER/Salomon)** will make his 100th World Cup Super G start in Wengen. In 57 of Baumann's starts he was representing Austria. He has only one Super G podium to date – a 3rd place in 2022/23 in Lake Louise (CAN).

- Team Canada has 99 men's Super G top-10 finishes. If any Canadian skier finishes in the top 10 in Wengen, Canada will become the eighth nation to reach 100.
- If an Italian athlete wins in Wengen, it will be team Italy's 20th World Cup Super G win. A win by an Austrian skier will be Austria's 90th. Italy lies 5th in a list headed by Austria.
