

PREVIEW MEN TEAM - SKI FLYING – Saturday 23 Mar 2024

Slovenia

- Slovenia are the reigning world champions in this discipline. Peter Prevc, Domen Prevc, Lovro Kos and Timi Zajc won the world title in Bad Mitterndorf on 28 January ahead of Austria and Germany.
- Slovenia won the ski flying team World Cup event in Planica in 2021/22, ahead of Norway and Austria. They finished second in this event in Planica in 2022/23 (behind Austria).
- Slovenia has won a total of 12 men's World Cup team events, including five in ski flying team events. Peter Prevc was part of all those teams.
- No other ski jumper won more than five ski flying team events in the World Cup than Prevc (5), and the only other active ski jumper on five wins is Norway's Johann André Forfang.

Other contenders

- **Austria** finished second in this discipline at the world championships in Bad Mitterndorf on 28 January 2024, behind Slovenia and ahead of Germany.
- Austria won this event in Planica last year, ahead of Slovenia and Norway.
- Coming into Planica, Stefan Kraft (2) and Daniel Huber (1) won three of the four individual ski flying World Cup events this season.
- **Norway** (8) has won the most World Cup team events in ski flying, including a record five in Planica.
- Norway won the ski flying team event five times in a row between 2016 and 2018, but the next five ski flying team World Cup events were won by five different nations.
- Norway (28) is trailing only Austria (39) on most World Cup wins in men's team events.
- **Germany** won the first-ever World Cup team event in ski flying, in Planica on 18 March 2000. Germany's second win in this event came 21 years later in Planica on 28 March 2021.
- **Japan** has won four team events in the World Cup, but not since a victory in Salt Lake City on 19 January 2001.
