

FACTS & FIGURES – Men's Super G in Val Gardena / Groeden

- **Marco Odermatt (SUI/ Stöckli)** is the double defending Super G World Cup champion.
- Odermatt claimed his first victory of the new Audi FIS World Cup season in the Super G at Beaver Creek on December 7.
- Odermatt leads the Super G standings after that first of seven races this season.
- In the previous two seasons Odermatt has won eight out of the 15 Super G races, including two victories last season and six in 2022/23.
- In that period Odermatt has never finished worse than fifth.
- Odermatt has never won at Val Gardena/ Groeden. His best Super G finish is third in Super G last season. He was second in the Downhill here in December 2022

- **Vincent Kriechmayr (AUT/ Head)** won the Super G in Val Gardena/ Groeden last season.
- Kriechmayr won the Super G here in December 2019 and was third in the Super G here in December 2021.
- He has also won a Downhill race at Val Gardena/ Groeden, in December 2022.
- Like Odermatt, Kriechmayr won twice last season, his eighth and ninth victories in the discipline.
- The 30-year-old finished second in the Super G rankings last season. It was his best finish since winning the Super G Crystal Globe in 2020-21.

- **Cyprien Sarrazin (FRA/ Rossignol)** is currently second in the standings after finishing second to Odermatt at Beaver Creek.
- Sarrazin has won one career World Cup Super G, at Wengen in January 2024.
- Sarrazin has never finished on the podium at Val Gardena/ Groeden.

- **Dominik Paris (ITA/ Nordica)** won the Downhill here last season. He was second in the Super G here in December 2014, and third in the Downhill at Val Gardena/ Groeden that season.
- The Italian finished inside the top-10 four times last season with a best of third in Kvitfjell.

- **Stefan Rogentin (SUI/ Fischer)** finish fourth in the Super G standings last season, his best result in any discipline. He has never finished on the podium at Val Gardena/ Groeden.

- **Raphael Hasser (AUT/ Fischer)** recorded his best ever Globe finish last season: two second places, plus a further four top-15 efforts helped the 27-year-old end up third.
