The role of a service man in alpine skiing is essential for athletes' performance in competition. This specialized technician is responsible for preparing, maintaining, and optimizing skis for each race based on snow conditions, weather, and the athlete's specific preferences. Their tasks include sharpening edges for maximum grip, applying the right wax for optimal glide, and precisely adjusting bindings.

The service man works closely with athletes to understand their needs and how they feel on the skis', ensuring equipment is perfectly tuned. Their expertise and attention to detail are critical for the athlete's performance and safety, directly impacting competition results.
