

- The Coop FIS Cross-Country World Cup's second stage since the Milano Cortina 2026 Olympic Winter Games will be held in **Lahti, Finland**. Lahti has hosted the World Cup since its very first season, in 1981/82, missing only four seasons. Lahti has hosted seven editions of the FIS Nordic World Ski Championships and will also host its eighth edition in 2029.
- Norwegian skiers have won 18 of the 20 Men's World Cup races held so far this season. In 13 of the 18 victories, another Norwegian finished second, and in 15 of those wins, there was another Norwegian on the podium.
- Norwegian skiers have recorded eight podium clean sweeps so far this season, after achieving 10 in the 2024/25 World Cup.
- Norwegian skiers have won the last 10 individual World Cup races. A non-Norwegian athlete has yet to win an individual World Cup race in 2026.
- Norway won all three Men's events of the first two World Cup stages this season, in Ruka, Finland, and Trondheim, Norway. The streak was broken in Davos, Switzerland, where **Lucas Chanavat (FRA)** won the Sprint. In Toblach, Italy, **Gus Schumacher (USA)** won the Tour de Ski-debuting 5km Heat Mass Start Free, preventing Norway from winning all six races of the Tour. These are the only two individual World Cup races won by a non-Norwegian athlete this season.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** won his 100th individual World Cup race - in his hometown of Trondheim, Norway - earlier this season. Klaebo became the first Men's athlete to reach this landmark, and second overall, joining compatriot **Marit Bjørgen (NOR)**, who claimed 114 World Cup wins before retiring in 2018.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** has won the Overall World Cup title five times, between 2017/18 and 2024/25. If he wins the 2025/26 Overall Crystal Globe, he will equal his countryman **Bjoern Daehlie (NOR)**, who holds the record of six Overall titles, won between 1991/92 and 1998/99. Klaebo is tied with **Gunde Svan (SWE)** on five titles.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** has held the record for most individual World Cup wins in a single season since 2022/23, when he topped the podium 19 times. Klaebo's 16 World Cup victories in the 2023/24 season is the second-highest number of World Cup wins in a single season. He has recorded 10 individual wins so far this season, including wins in the last four World Cup races.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** also holds the record for most individual podiums in a single season since 2022/23, when he finished in the top three 23

times in individual World Cup races. He has 12 individual podiums so far this season.

- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** won the Sprint Free in Falun, Sweden, last weekend, with **Lars Heggen (NOR)** in second place and **Benjamin Moser (AUT)** third. This was the second career podium for Moser, and the first one in a Sprint race.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** won the Skiathlon Classic/Free in Falun, Sweden, last weekend, with **Harald Oestberg Amundsen (NOR)** in second place and **Martin Loewstroem Nyenget (NOR)** third, for the eight Norwegian podium clean sweep of the season.
- In the 2024/25 edition of the World Cup held in Lahti last season, which was the final World Cup stage of the season, **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** won both the Sprint Free and the 50km Mass Start Classic. He also won the Team Sprint Free, partnering with **Evan Northug (NOR)**.
- **Johannes Hoesflot Klaebo (NOR)** dominated the Men's events of the Milano Cortina 2026 Winter Olympic Games, winning all six gold medals on offer. Klaebo has won a total of 11 gold medals at the Winter Olympic Games, more than any other athlete.
