Women's Super G Kvitfjell Stat Sheet

Previous Super G Race (Val di Fassa) Stats

- **Elena Curtoni's (ITA/Head)** win in **Val di Fassa** ahead of **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** was **Curtoni's** second win in 99 Super G starts, making her the 44th woman (and sixth Italian woman) to win more than one SG race. **Curtoni's** previous SG win also came on Italian snow, in **Cortina d'Ampezzo** in 2021/22. **Curtoni** is the fifth woman to win a SG race this season.
- **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie's (NOR/Head)** 2nd in **Val di Fassa** saw her equal **Ragnhild Mowinckel (NOR)** on 7 Super G podiums, which is the most among Norwegian women. However, among the 10 Norwegian women and men who have claimed more than 2 SG podiums, **Lie** is the only one without a SG win. The result also saw **Lie** equal **Andrine Flemmen (NOR)** for second-most World Cup podiums in all disciplines among Norwegian women (11), behind leader **Mowinckel** (14).
- **Asja Zenere's (ITA/Salomon)** 3rd in **Val di Fassa** was her first World Cup podium in any discipline and came in her 50th World Cup start in all disciplines, and 10th in Super G. **Zenere's** previous best SG finish was 20th in **Kvitfjell** in 2024/25; she is the 17th Italian woman to make at least one SG podium.
- **Sofia Goggia's (ITA/Atomic)** 9th in **Val di Fassa** was her lowest Super G finish this season, while **Alice Robinson's (NZL/Salomon)** equal-4th meant the race for the SG globe reaches the World Cup Finals.

Globe Scenarios

- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** (449 points) leads the Super G globe standings by 63 points ahead of **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)** (386 pts), the only skier who can pass **Goggia**. **Robinson** can only win the globe if she finishes 1st and **Goggia** finishes 7th or lower (36 points or fewer), or if **Robinson** finishes 2nd and **Goggia** finishes 15th or lower (16 points or fewer). **Goggia's** previous best SG globe finish is 3rd (2024/25) and **Robinson's** is 17th (2023/24 and 2024/25).
- If **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** wins the SG globe, she will be the second Italian woman to do so after **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** in 2021/22.
- If **Goggia** wins the SG globe, three skiers can still finish 2nd - **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)** (386 pts), **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** (304 pts) and **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** (289 pts). To pass **Robinson**, either **Aicher** or **Lie** must win and rely on **Robinson** scoring 17 points or fewer (if **Aicher** wins) or 2 points or fewer (if **Lie** wins). **Aicher's** previous best SG globe finish is 15th (2024/25).
- If **Goggia** wins the SG globe and **Robinson** finishes 2nd, six skiers can finish 3rd - **Aicher** (304 pts), **Lie** (289 pts), **Romane Miradoli (FRA/Dynastar)** (260 pts), **Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle)** (244 pts), **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)** (234 pts) and **Malorie Blanc (SUI/Atomic)** (233 points).

Kvitfjell Stats

- **Kvitfjell / Hafjell** has hosted eight women's Super G races. The first, in 1995/96, was won by **Helen Ingeborg Marken (NOR)** by 0.66s ahead of **Katja Seizinger (GER)**, which is the biggest winning margin and the only SG win by a Norwegian woman there. In 2005/06 in **Hafjell**, **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** was part of a three-way tie for 1st with **Nadia Styger (SUI)** and **Michaela Dorfmeister (AUT)**.

- In 2022/23, **Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head)** and **Nina Ortlieb (AUT/Head)** won the two Super G races in **Kvitfjell**. **Huetter's** win by 0.01s remains the smallest winning margin there, while **Ortlieb's** win was her second of two career SG wins so far.
- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** has the most Super G podiums this season with four from seven starts for a 57% podium strike rate, followed by **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)** and **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** (both on 3) with a 43% strike rate. **Aicher** and **Goggia** are the only women to have won more than one SG race this season (2 each). **Goggia** finished 3rd in **Kvitfjell** in 2024/25.
- **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** has the most top-6 Super G finishes this season (6), ahead of **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)** (5), followed by seven skiers on three each. **Goggia** is the only skier to have finished in the top 10 in all seven SG races this season, followed by **Robinson** (6 top-10 finishes).
- Three skiers in the top 8 of the Super G globe standings have not won an SG race this season - **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)**, **Romane Miradoli (FRA/Dynastar)** and **Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle)**. **Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head)** is the only skier in the top 10 of the SG globe standings to have not made a SG podium this season. **Huetter's** last SG podium came in **St. Moritz** in 2024/25.
- If **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** wins, she will become the eighth woman, and second Italian woman, after **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)**, to reach 10 Super G wins. Any podium for **Goggia** will see her move from equal-seventh for women's SG podiums on 23 alongside **Gerg Hilde (GER)** to outright seventh (24).
- If **Alice Robinson (NZL/Salomon)** wins, she will be the 45th woman to win more than one World Cup Super G race. All three of **Robinson's** SG podiums, including her only win, have come this season. If **Robinson** wins the SG globe, she will be the first skier from a nation outside of Europe or North America to win a globe in any women's or men's discipline.
- If **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** wins, she will become the first German woman to win more than two SG races in a season since **Katja Seizinger (GER)** won four in 1997/98. A podium for **Aicher** will make her the 52nd woman to reach five SG podiums.
- If **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** makes the podium she will surpass **Ragnhild Mowinckel** for the most Super G podiums among Norwegian women (both on 7).
- If **Ester Ledecka (CZE/Kaestle)** makes the podium it will be her 13th World Cup podium across all disciplines (**Sarka Strachova** has the most for **Czechia** with 17) and make her the 52nd woman to reach five SG podiums. **Ledecka** finished 3rd in **Kvitfjell** in 2023/24.
- **Italy** and **Norway** both have 55 women's and men's Super G wins heading into **Kvitfjell**, and either could take outright third behind **Austria** (153) and **Switzerland** (102). **Germany** has 37 women's SG wins, needing one more to equal **USA** (38) in equal-third behind **Austria** (64) and **Switzerland** (48).
- **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)** will become the fourth woman to reach 100 World Cup Super G starts after **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** (111), **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** (109) and **Renate Goetschli (AUT)** (106). **Curtoni** finished 2nd in **Kvitfjell** in 2022/23.
- For career Super G starts, **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)** will make her 100th; **Ilka Stuhec (SLO/Kaestle)** her 90th; and **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** and **Nadia Delago (ITA/Atomic)** their 50th. **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)** and **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** are the only two skiers to have started all 48 Super G races from 2020/21 until now.
