

FACTS & FIGURES – Team Parallel

• **Austria** has won the Team Parallel a record three times (out of nine world championships editions) and can become the first four-time winner.

Austria can win the Team Parallel on home snow for the second time (after Schladming 2013). No other country has ever won it on home snow.

That Austria win in 2013 was the last time the host country even reached the podium in Team Parallel at the world championships.

Austria won medals in the first five world championships Team Parallel events but has only won one medal in the last four editions.

- **Austria** and **Sweden** have won a record six world championships Team Parallel medals and can become the first countries to win seven.
- Sweden's six medals don't include any golds (three silvers and three bronzes), while Austria's six medals do not include any bronzes (three golds and three silvers).
- Austria and Sweden have been on the podium together four times, in four consecutive editions in 2007, 2011, 2013 and 2015 (the event was canceled in 2009). Austria finished ahead of Sweden all four times.
- **France** is the only country other than Austria to win the Team Parallel more than once. France can win it for the third time (after 2011 and 2017).
- **USA** won the Team Parallel in 2023 and can become the second country to win it two editions in a row, after Austria (2013-2015). That gold is USA's only medal in the Team Parallel at the world championships.
- **Norway** is the only country to have been on the podium in the last two editions (silver in 2023, gold in 2021). Those are Norway's only medals in the Team Parallel at the world championships.
- Ten different countries have won the 12 medals in the last four editions, with only **Norway** and **Sweden** reaching the podium twice during that time.
- **Germany** won the first world championships Team Parallel in 2005 but has only managed two bronzes in the eight editions since.
- Despite being one of the strongest and deepest countries, **Switzerland** has only reached the Team Parallel podium twice: winning gold in 2019 and bronze in 2007.
