

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Men’s Slalom Schladming stat sheet

Previous SL race (Kitzbuehel) stats

- **Manuel Feller (AUT/Atomic)** won the most recent Slalom race in Kitzbuehel on 25 January. The runner-up was **Loic Meillard (SUI/Rossignol)**, with **Linus Strasser (GER/Head)** finishing in 3rd place.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)**, who finished 4th in Kitzbuehel, took the lead in the Slalom World Cup after eight events with 401 points, **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** is in second with 375 points, **Atle Lie McGrath (NOR/Head)** is third on 372.
- **Manuel Feller (Atomic)** won his seventh Slalom World Cup race, which is the 7th best all-time result among Austrian male skiers, and 9th best among both men and women. **Marlies Schild** has the most Slalom World Cup wins for team Austria with 35.
- **Manuel Feller’s (Atomic)** win allowed team Austria to end its third all-time longest streak of 22 World Cup Slalom races without a win, which had started after Feller’s in the 2023/24 season. The longest winless drought for Austria lasted for 43 races during the 1977/78–1982/83 seasons.
- **Loic Meillard (Rossignol)** reached the podium in Kitzbuehel for the 15th time in his career. He needs two more top three finishes to catch up with **Daniel Yule (Atomic)** at the top of the list of the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Swiss male athletes with 17. Meillard is the only Swiss skier to have claimed a Slalom World Cup podium since the start of the 2024/25 season.
- **Linus Strasser (GER/Head)** claimed his 13th career Slalom World Cup podium by finishing 3rd in Kitzbuehel. He is the only skier to have finished inside the top five in the four most recent Kitzbuehel Slalom races. Strasser won the 2023/24 race, finished 4th in 2022/23 and 5th in 2024/25.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** has finished inside the top ten of every Slalom (1st, 2nd, 4th, 4th, 4th, 5th, 10th and a DNF) and every Giant Slalom (2nd, 2nd, 5th, 7th, 10th and a DNF) race he has managed to finish during the 2025/26 season.
- **Lucas Pinheiro Braathen (BRA/Atomic)** and **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** are the only athletes to have finished inside the top ten in seven out of ten Slalom World Cup races of the season.
- **Eduard Hallberg (Fischer)** claimed his fifth top ten finish of the 2025/26 season in Kitzbuehel. He now has six Alpine World Cup top ten results, making him the sixth highest among Finnish skiers. **Tanja Poutiainen** leads the list with 149 top ten results. Hallberg, who was named FIS Longines Rising Star in 2024/25, recorded only three top 15 finishes with a best result of 8th place before the current season.

- **Timon Haugan (NOR)** finished 9th in Kitzbuehel which allowed him to draw level with **Trina Bakke** in 7th place on the all-time list with 31 career Slalom World Cup top ten finishes among Norwegian athletes, men or women. **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** leads the field with 94 top ten finishes.
- In Kitzbuehel **Paco Rassat (FRA/Head)** recorded his worst result of the season, finishing 14th. Previously he had claimed a spot inside the top six of every Slalom World Cup race he managed to finish - recording one DNF in Val d'Isere. Before the start of this season Rassat had only one top ten result in 34 Slalom World Cup starts – a 9th place in Wengen in January 2025.

Schladming stats

- Schladming first appeared on the World Cup Slalom calendar in December 1975. A total of 31 Slalom World Cup races have been held there to date.
- **Timon Haugan (NOR/Van Deer)** won the 2024/25 Schladming Slalom race. The runner-up was **Manuel Feller (AUT/Atomic)**, with **Fabio Gstrein (AUT/Atomic)** finishing in 3rd place.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** needs one more win in Schladming to become the athlete with the most wins here. Currently he is level with **Benjamin Raich (AUT)** with three wins both.
- Team Austria has the most wins in the Schladming World Cup Slaloms: 14. Norway has five victories and Germany has three.
- **Marco Schwarz (Atomic)** was the last Austrian athlete to win a World Cup Slalom race on the home slopes of Schladming back in the 2020/21 season.
- **Manuel Feller (Atomic)** is the only athlete to finish within the top five in the four most recent Schladming World Cup Slalom races. He claimed two podiums on the way, finishing 3rd in 2021/22 and 2nd in 2024/25.
- **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** needs one more podium in any discipline to draw level with **Vreni Schneider (SUI)** and **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI)**, who lie in equal 7th place on the all-time list with 101 career World Cup podiums. **Mikaela Shiffrin (USA)** leads the way with 164 podiums.
- If **Henrik Kristoffersen (NOR/Van Deer)** finishes in the top 10, he'll move to 5th place on his own in the all-time men's list with 189 career Alpine World Cup top ten finishes. **Kjetil Andre Aamodt (NOR)** leads the field with 233 top ten finishes.
- If **Manuel Feller (Atomic)** finishes in the top three he will move into fifth place outright on his own on the list for the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Austrian athletes with 22. **Marcel Hirscher (Van Deer)**, now representing the Netherlands, is on top of the list with 65 podiums.

- If **Clement Noel (FRA/Dynastar)** wins in Schladming he will join **Marc Girardelli (LUX)** in 5th place on the all-time for the most men's World Cup Slalom wins with 16. **Ingemar Stenmark (SWE)** leads the field with 40 Slalom victories.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** needs two more podium finishes to join **Finn Christian Jagge** in the 3rd place for the most Slalom World Cup podiums among Norwegian athletes with 17. **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** leads this list with 59 top three results.
- **Atle Lie McGrath (Head)** and **Timon Haugan (Van Deer)** have five Slalom World Cup victories each. A win by either would see them join **Ole Christian Furuseth** in 3rd place for the most Slalom World Cup wins among Norwegian athletes. **Henrik Kristoffersen (Van Deer)** leads this list with 25 victories.
- **Loic Meillard (Rossignol)** needs two more podium finishes to join **Franz Heinzer** and **Peter Mueller** in 6th place for the most Alpine World Cup podiums among male Swiss athletes with 112. **Didier Cuche** leads this list with 186 top three results.
- **Eduard Hallberg (Fischer)** claimed his fifth top ten finish of the 2025/26 season in Kitzbuehel. Hallberg now has six Alpine World Cup top ten results. He needs two more to draw level with **Henna Raita** for equal fifth place among Finnish skiers, men or women. Hallberg recorded only three top 15 finishes with a best result of 8th place before the current season.
- **Victor Muffat-Jeandet (FRA/Salomon)** has the opportunity in Schladming to stretch his streak of World Cup Slalom point-scoring races to 13. The streak that started in last season's Kitzbuehel is currently the longest in the field. The French skier has finished inside the top ten three times during the streak, with a highest result of 6th place in Kranjska Gora in March 2025.
- **Luca Aerni (Fischer)** will take his 129th Slalom World Cup start to draw level with **Ramon Zenhaeusern** in equal-third spot for the most Slalom World Cup starts among Swiss athletes, men or women. **Wendy Holdener** leads the list with 134 starts.
