

Audi FIS Alpine Ski World Cup 2025/26 – Women’s Downhill Soldeu stat sheet

Milano Cortina 2026 Olympic Winter Games DH stats

- **Breezy Johnson’s (USA/Atomic)** Downhill gold at Milano Cortina 2026 made her the second **USA** woman to win an Olympic DH title, after **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** at Vancouver 2010. **Johnson’s** 0.04s win is the smallest winning margin of the 21 Olympic women’s Downhill races.
- **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** is the reigning World Championship (WSC) and Olympic Winter Games (OWG) Downhill champion, and is the first woman to hold both titles at the same time without a World Cup win in any discipline. Four other women have held both titles at the same time: **Corinne Suter (SUI/Head)** - WSC 2021, OWG 2022; **Tina Maze (SLO)** - OWG 2014, WSC 2015; **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** - WSC 2009, OWG 2010; and **Michela Figini (SUI)** - OWG 1984, WSC 1985.
- At age 30 years and 20 days, **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** is the third-oldest of the 21 Olympic women’s DH champions, behind **Tina Maze (SLO)** (30 years, 286 days at Sochi 2014) and **Michaela Dorfmeister (AUT)** (32 years, 327 days at Torino 2006).
- **Emma Aicher’s (GER/Head)** silver at Milano Cortina 2026 made her the second German skier to win an Olympic Downhill medal since reunification, after **Katja Seizinger (GER)** won back-to-back DH gold medals at Lillehammer 1994 and Nagano 1998. Prior to reunification, four women and two men representing **Federal Republic of Germany** won Olympic DH medals.
- At age 22 years and 87 days, **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** was the youngest medallist in any women’s or men’s Alpine skiing event at Milano Cortina 2026, and the youngest women’s Olympic Downhill medallist since Lillehammer 1994, when **Katja Seizinger (GER)** won gold at age 21 and **Isolde Kostner (ITA)** won bronze at age 18.
- **Sofia Goggia’s (ITA/Atomic)** bronze at Milano Cortina 2026 made her the first women’s or men’s skier to win three Olympic Downhill medals, having already won gold at PyeongChang 2018 and silver at Beijing 2022.

Soldeu DH stats

- **Soldeu** has hosted two women’s World Cup Downhill races, won by **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)** in 2018/19 and **Ilka Stuhec (SLO/Kaestle)** in 2022/23. **Puchner** finished 11th in DH at Milano Cortina 2026 while **Stuhec** finished 15th.
- There are four Downhill races left this season. **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)**, who is out after suffering further serious injury to her leg at Milano Cortina 2026, leads the DH standings on 400 points. The next three skiers are separated by less than 50 points - **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** on 256 pts, **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** on 232 pts, and **Laura Pirovano (ITA/Head)** on 207 pts.
- **Laura Pirovano (ITA/Head)** shares the lead with **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** and **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** for most women’s Downhill top-10 finishes this season (5). However, of the eight women to have made at least three top-10 DH finishes this season, **Pirovano** is the only one not to have made a World Cup podium in any discipline in her career (from 121 starts).

- **Emma Aicher (GER/Head)** and **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** both have eight World Cup podiums across all disciplines, which is equal-10th among German women. All eight of **Weidle-Winkelmann's** podiums have come in DH, which is fifth-highest among German women, compared to three for **Aicher**. Of the 13 German women to have made a DH podium in their career, **Weidle-Winkelmann** (8) and **Martina Ertl-Rentz** (1) are the only two without a DH win.
- A win for **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** will make her the fourth woman to reach 20 Downhill wins after **Lindsey Vonn (USA/Head)** (45), **Annemarie Moser-Proell (AUT)** (36) and **Renate Goetschl (AUT)** (24).
- **Nicol Delago (ITA/Atomic)** won her first World Cup race in the last Downhill in **Tarvisio**. A win in Soldeu would make her the sixth Italian woman with more than one DH victory, equal with **Elena Curtoni (ITA/Head)**, **Federica Brignone (ITA/Rossignol)** and **Elena Fanchini (ITA)** on two DH wins. Only **Sofia Goggia (ITA/Atomic)** (19) and **Isolde Kostner (ITA)** (12) have more among Italian women.
- If **Cornelia Huetter (AUT/Head)** makes the podium she will become the fifth Austrian woman (and 15th from any nation) to achieve 20 Downhill podiums. A podium for **Ilka Stuhec (SLO/Kaestle)** will make her the 23rd woman to reach 15 DH podiums.
- **Mirjam Puchner (AUT/Atomic)**, **Breezy Johnson (USA/Atomic)** and **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** are all on nine World Cup podiums in all disciplines, vying to become the 144th woman to reach 10.
- If **Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (NOR/Head)** wins, she will become the first Norwegian to win more than one women's Downhill race (**Lie** and **Ragnhild Mowinckel** are equal on one win each). A podium for **Lie** will make her the fourth Norwegian woman to reach 10 World Cup podiums. **Norway** is on 89 women's World Cup podiums, needing one to become the 13th nation to reach 90.
- If **Malorie Blanc (SUI/Atomic)** makes the podium, she will become the 25th Swiss woman to make more than one Downhill podium. **Blanc's** first DH podium (2nd in **St. Anton** in 2024/25) came in her very first DH World Cup race, which made her the second woman this century to make the podium in her very first World Cup DH race, after **Lara Gut-Behrami (SUI/Head)** in 2008 in **St. Moritz**.
- **Austria** has 1248 women's World Cup podiums, needing two top-3 finishes to become the first nation to reach 1250. On the men's side, only **Austria's** men have amassed more (1716).
- **Switzerland** has 99 women's Downhill wins. A win for a Swiss skier would see **Switzerland** become the second nation - after **Austria** (127) - to reach 100 women's DH wins.
- **Italy** has 118 women's Downhill podiums, needing two top-3 finishes to become the sixth nation to reach 120, after **Austria** (352), **Switzerland** (276), **USA** (163), **Germany** (127) and **France** (124).
- **Kira Weidle-Winkelmann (GER/Rossignol)** and **Laura Gauche (FRA/Head)** will make their 75th DH start, while **Romane Miradoli (FRA/Dynastar)** will make her 70th. For total World Cup starts, **Ester Ledecka (SLO/Kaestle)** will make her 110th, while **Christina Ager (AUT/Atomic)** will make her 100th.
