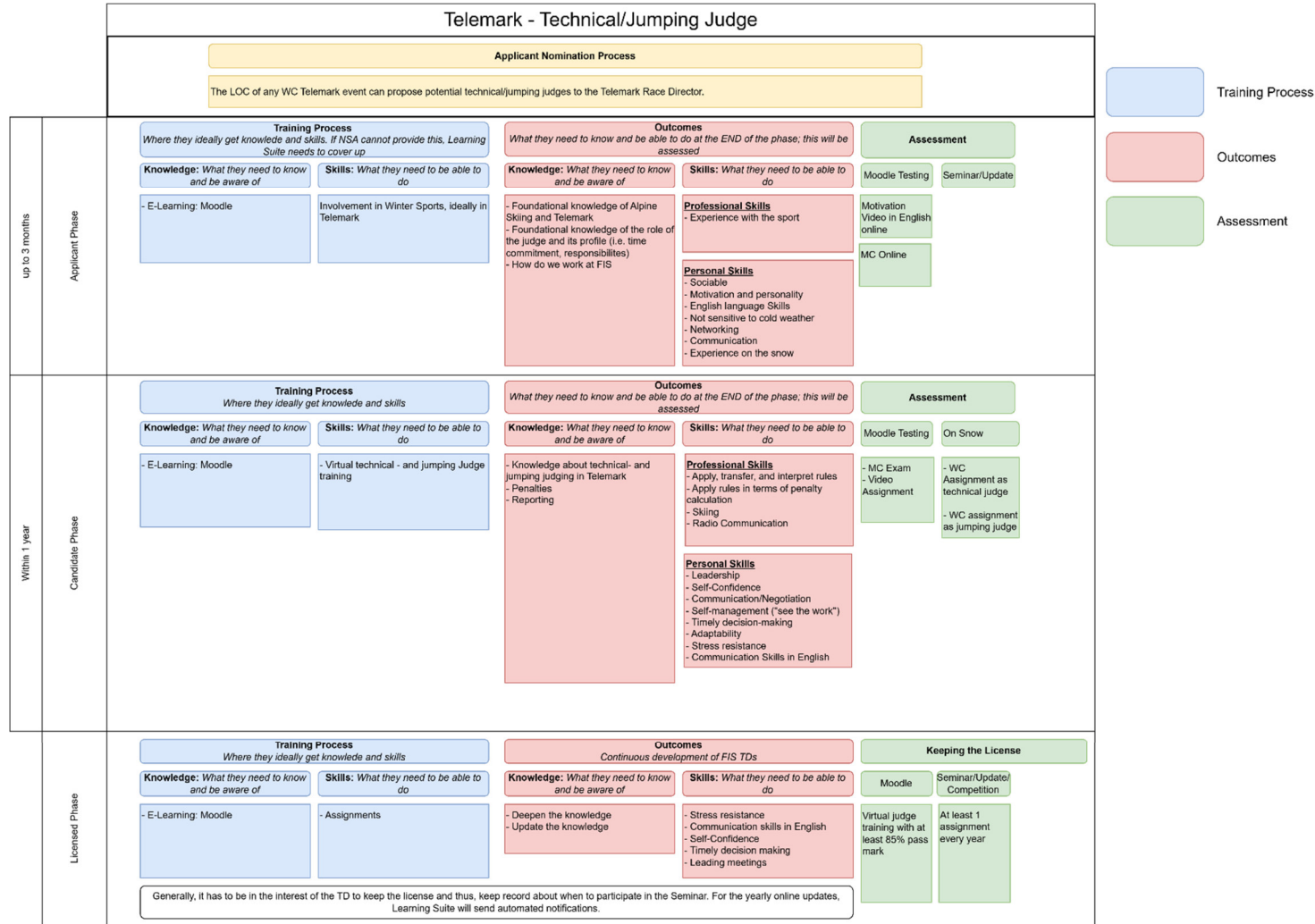

2. Summary of Judge Education

2.1 Application Process

The LOC of any WC Telemark even can propose potential technical/jumping judges to the Telemark Race Director.

Before being accepted as an applicant, a full list of people must be submitted for the respective event. The list should be submitted to the FIS Telemark desk (currently Daniel Kohler) no later than four weeks before the event. The Telemark Race Director has the final decision as to their acceptance.

Upon acceptance to become a FIS Telemark Technical/Jumping Judge, the applicant will receive access to the FIS E-Learning platform Moodle.

2.2 Applicant Phase

The Applicant must:

- Study the online course “Welcome to FIS”
- Study the online course “How do we work at FIS”
- Prove necessary English skills
- Pass the online Multiple-Choice exam

2.3 Candidate Phase

Within the first year:

The Candidate must:

- successfully complete self-regulated e-learning about technical- and jumping judge theory in Moodle
- successfully complete a virtual technical- and jumping judge training on Moodle
- Pass an online exam on Moodle consisting of:
 - o Multiple Choice Questions
 - o Video Assignment

After passing the online exam, the Candidate receives a Pre-license and added to the Pre-Licensed FIS Telemark Judge Registry at the FIS Telemark Office:

The Candidate is assigned under the supervision of an experienced technical-/jumping judge OR the Telemark Race Director OR an appointed representative to a:

- practical examination as technical judge
- practical examination a jumping judge

as part of a normal WC judge assignment³.

The Telemark Race Director may decide not to issue a Judge license if the candidate has not completed all requirements or is deemed to be unsuitable. In this event the Race Director may decide as to whether the candidate may continue to train as a FIS Telemark Judge, and which parts of the procedure must be repeated.

If the candidates are suitable and accepted, they will become official FIS Telemark Judge immediately and added to the FIS Telemark Judge Registry at the FIS Telemark Office.

2.4 Licensed Phase

To keep the license, the licensed Judge must:

- Complete a virtual judge training every two years with at least 85% pass mark

³ a specified % of judges may be pre-licensed judges

- Prove active engagement in Judge work demonstrated by assignments. Ideally, any Judge should prove one assignment/year. Given the limited number of Telemark races an assignment every two years might be accepted upon approval by the Telemark Race Director.

A Judge license will be revoked if the Judge fails to work as an assigned FIS Telemark Judge for three consecutive years without justified cause.

3. Training and Education Opportunities

3.1 Practical (In-Service) Education and Training

Beyond theoretical instruction, practical education and training—defined as active engagement in designated responsibilities during official events—constitutes an essential component in the development of Candidates and the ongoing qualification of licensed Judges. All practical training for Candidates is rigorously supervised, with detailed reports submitted to FIS to ensure thorough evaluation, constructive feedback, and continuous professional growth.

3.2 E-Learning

The overall FIS education strategy considers a blended-learning approach. As such, all applicants, candidates and licensed Judges have access to the FIS E-Learning Platform Moodle (www.edu.fis-ski.com). Moodle is meant to provide a platform for self-regulated e-learning at the discretion of the user. Additionally, it supports the in-person and/or guided e-learning process with supplementary information and learning tools.

4. Governance of Judge Education

The responsibility for all Judge matters, including the educational content, mode and methods of education, belongs to the Telemark Race Director.

The NSA are responsible for assuring that all new FIS technical information is distributed to all their national and international FIS Technical Officials.
