

Ski Cross World Cup 2025/26 – Women's Arosa stat sheet

- **Sandra Naeslund (SWE)** won both races of the opening event in Val Thorens last week, the third time she has done so on the slopes of the French resort. In total she has registered double victories on the same weekend 10 times across six venues.
- Of the four times **Sandra Naeslund (SWE)** has won the opening race of the season, she has gone on to win the Crystal Globe on three occasions - doing so in 2018, 2022 and 2023 - with the only time she failed to win the overall standings being in her injury-hit 2024 season.
- **Sandra Naeslund's (SWE)** two wins in Val Thorens last week means she has now won 41 World Cup races, more than any other athlete of any gender. She is five wins clear of the next most successful athlete - **Marielle Thompson (CAN)**, who has 36 career victories.
- **Marielle Berger Sabbatel's (FRA)** second-place finish in the final race of the Val Thorens opening weekend means it is now 15 podium finishes since her most recent World Cup win back in 2023.
- **Courtney Hoffos (CAN)** registered the 12th World Cup podium finish of her career in the opening race of the season last week, extending her record as the female athlete with the most top 3 finishes never to have won a race. She is now equal with **Stanley Hayer's (CAN)** record of 12.
- **Mylene Ballet Bez (FRA)** notched her first career World Cup podium when finishing 3rd in the opening race of the season last week in Val Thorens.
- **Fanny Smith (SUI)** is the only Swiss female athlete to have won a World Cup race on the slopes of Arosa.
- No female has won more times in Arosa than **Fanny Smith (SUI)** and **Marielle Thompson (CAN)**, with both athletes tied on four wins apiece.
- **Marielle Thompson (CAN)** has finished on the podium in Arosa in each one of the past five seasons, and in total has taken a spot on the podium in 9 of her 11 starts at the Swiss resort.
- Despite winning in Arosa four times between 2015 and 2021, **Fanny Smith (SUI)** has failed to make it onto the podium in her last three starts at the Swiss resort.
