

Preview Alpine Skiing 2023/2024 World Cup - Women

Mikaela Shiffrin

- Last season, Mikaela Shiffrin became the fourth skier to win the overall crystal globe at least five times, after Marcel Hirscher (8), Annemarie Moser-Pröll (6) and Marc Girardelli (5).
- Shiffrin has won 15 World Cup rankings. She has five globes in the overall, seven in the slalom, two in the giant slalom and one in the super-G. Only two other female skiers won as many World Cup rankings (overall and disciplines): Lindsey Vonn (20) and Moser-Pröll (16). **Note:** Moser-Pröll also won the combined in 1974/75 and 1978/79, but in those seasons there was no trophy awarded in the combined.
- Shiffrin (7) can equal Ingemar Stenmark (8) for most slalom crystal globes. Vonn (8 in downhill) and Moser-Pröll (7 in downhill) are the only other women to have won a specific World Cup ranking at least seven times.
- Shiffrin has won an all-time record 88 World Cup events. She surpassed Ingemar Stenmark (86) in March 2023.
- Shiffrin (53 in the slalom) also holds the all-time record for most World Cup victories in a specific event. Next up is Ingemar Stenmark on 46 wins in the men's giant slalom.
- Shiffrin can become the first skier - male or female - to win at least one World Cup event in as many as 12 **successive** seasons. Vreni Schneider (1984/85 to 1994/95), Alberto Tomba (1987/88 - 1997/98) and Renate Götschl (1996/97 to 2006/07) also had a run of 11 seasons.

Petra Vlhová

- Petra Vlhová has finished in the top three in the overall World Cup ranking in each of the last five seasons, including a victory in 2020/21.
- Vlhová (19) is one short of becoming the sixth woman on at least 20 victories in World Cup slalom events. Mikaela Shiffrin (53), Marlies Schild (35), Vreni Schneider (34), Erika Hess (21) and Janica Kostelic (20) are ahead of Vlhová.
- Vlhová is one of three women to have claimed at least one World Cup victory in each of the previous eight seasons, alongside Shiffrin (last 11) and Federica Brignone (last 8).

Other contenders

- **Sofia Goggia** (4) can become the fourth woman to win the downhill crystal globe at least five times, after Lindsey Vonn (8), Annemarie Moser-Pröll (7) and Renate Götschl (5).
- Goggia can become the third woman to win the downhill crystal globe in at least four successive seasons, after Vonn (6, 2007/08-2012/13) and Moser-Pröll (5, 1970/71-1974/75).
- **Lara Gut-Behrami** has won the super-G crystal globe four times, including last season. She can join Katja Seizinger (5) and Vonn (5) on a record five super-G crystal globes among women.
- Gut-Behrami has 37 World Cup victories to her name, including 19 in the super-G. She can become the third skier - male or female - to win at least 20 super-G World Cup events, after Vonn (28) and Hermann Maier (24).
- Gut-Behrami (12) can become the third woman to claim at least one World Cup win in at least 13 different seasons, after Götschl (14) and Vonn (13).
- **Ragnhild Mowinckel** can become the first Norwegian woman to win a crystal globe. Norwegian skiers have won 44 World Cup rankings, but all of those were in men's events.
- Norwegian women have recorded eight top three finishes in World Cup rankings (3 second places, 5 third places), including a third place by Mowinckel in last season's super-G standings.
