

PREVIEW WOMEN'S SUPER G CORTINA D'AMPEZZO – Sunday 22 Jan 2023

Federica Brignone

- Federica Brignone took the lead in the women's super-G ranking after a first and second place in St. Anton am Arlberg last week.
- By winning in St. Anton am Arlberg last week, Brignone (32 years old) became the fifth woman to win a super-G World Cup event after their 32nd birthday, and the first since Lindsey Vonn's win in Val d'Isère on 16 December 2017.
- Only Michaela Dorfmeister (3) and Elisabeth Görgl (2) won multiple women's super-G World Cup events after their 32nd birthday.
- Brignone has already won World Cup events on Italian snow in Kronplatz, Sestriere and Val di Fassa, but has yet to win in Cortina d'Ampezzo. Her best result here is a fourth place in the women's super-G on 23 January 2022.
- Going into this weekend Brignone (21) leads Sofia Goggia (20) on the most World Cup wins among Italian female alpine skiers. Goggia races in the downhill events on Friday 20 and Saturday 21 January.
- Italian women won three of the previous 55 super-G World Cup events on Italian snow, including the last two: Brignone in Val di Fassa on 28 February 2021 and Elena Curtoni in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 23 January 2022.
- Isolde Kostner was the first Italian alpine skier to win a women's super-G World Cup event on Italian snow, in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 25 January 1997.

Mikaela Shiffrin

- **Mikaela Shiffrin goes into this World Cup weekend level on 82 World Cup wins with Lindsey Vonn.**
- Shiffrin only has Ingemar Stenmark ahead of her in World Cup wins. The Swede claimed 86 triumphs.
- Shiffrin is 27 years old. Vonn was 33 years old when she won her last World Cup event, Stenmark was 32.
- Shiffrin has won one super-G World Cup event on Italian snow, in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 20 January 2019.
- Going into this weekend, Shiffrin has won six of the last eight World Cup races she has competed in. The exceptions are a sixth place in the giant slalom in Kranjska Gora (first race) and a second place in the slalom in Flachau.

Other contenders

- The last eight women's World Cup super-G races have all been won by different skiers. This sequence started with Elena Curtoni's win in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 23 January 2022. **Note:** Brignone won twice in this run but shared the win in Garmisch-Partenkirchen with Conelia Hütler on 30 January 2022.
- **Corinne Suter** won the opening super-G event this World Cup campaign (Lake Louise), but her best super-G finish since is a 10th place in St. Anton am Arlberg on 15 January 2023.
- **Lara Gut-Behrami** won the most recent women's super-G World Cup event on 15 January, in St. Anton am Arlberg. Gut-Behrami (18) is second on the women's list for most World Cup super-G wins, behind Lindsey Vonn (28).
- Only Lindsey Vonn (6) and Renate Götschl (5) have won more women's super-G World Cup events in Cortina d'Ampezzo than Gut-Behrami (2).
- **Elena Curtoni** (1) can join five other Italian female skiers with multiple World Cup wins in the super-G; Federica Brignone (8), Sofia Goggia (5), Karen Putzer (4), Isolde Kostner (3) and Deborah Compagnoni (2).
- Curtoni can become the third Italian woman to win a super-G and downhill event in a single World Cup season, after Isolde Kostner (3 times) and Sofia Goggia (3).
- Curtoni's only super-G win in the World Cup came in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 23 January 2022.
- **Ragnhild Mowinckel** (1) can become the first Norwegian female alpine skier to win multiple World Cup super-G races. She won the last super-G race of the 2021/22 season in Courchevel.
- **Marta Bassino** finished on the podium in a super-G World Cup event on three occasions. Her best super-G result in this season's World Cup was a third place in St. Anton am Arlberg on 15 January.
