

## PREVIEW WOMEN'S SLALOM FLACHAU – Tuesday 10 Jan 2023

### Mikaela Shiffrin

- Mikaela Shiffrin (82) has equalled the women's record of 82 World Cup wins, by Lindsey Vonn. Vonn won a World Cup event in 13 seasons, Shiffrin in 11.
- Shiffrin only has Ingemar Stenmark ahead of her in World Cup wins. The Swede claimed 86 triumphs. He won an event in 13 seasons.
- Shiffrin is 27 years old. Vonn was 33 years old when she won her last World Cup event, Stenmark was 32.
- Shiffrin has won four slalom World Cups in Flachau, most of all women. This includes a win in the most recent World Cup slalom here on 12 January 2021.

### Petra Vlhová

- Petra Vlhová has claimed seven podium finishes in this season's World Cup (G0-S2-B5), but she has yet to claim her first win this campaign.
- The last woman to claim more podium finishes in a season without having won any World Cup event was Wendy Holdener (8 in 2018/19). The record is 10 podium results without a win by Tina Maze in 2011/12.
- Vlhová has won 17 slalom World Cups, joint-sixth with Anja Pärson (17).
- Vlhová has won two World Cup slalom events in Flachau. She only won more slalom World Cups in Levi (5) and Zagreb (3).

### Other contenders

- **Wendy Holdener** (2 wins in 2022/23) can become the first Swiss woman to win three slalom World Cups in a single season since Vreni Schneider in 1994/95 (4 wins).
- **Anna Swenn-Larsson** (1 win in 2022/23) can become the first Swedish woman to win multiple World Cup slalom events in a single season since Anja Pärson in 2005/06 (3).
- **Katharina Liensberger** is hoping on a return to form in Flachau where she finished second the last time a slalom World Cup was held here, in 2021. The only Austrian women to have won a World Cup event on home snow in Flachau were Renate Götschl (super-G in January 1995) and Marlies Schild (slaloms in January 2010 and December 2011).
- **Ana Bucik** could claim her first podium finish in a World Cup slalom. Following Tina Maze's second place in Flachau in January 2015, only one Slovenian woman reached the podium in a World Cup slalom: Andreja Slokar won in Courchevel in March 2022.
- **Lena Dürr** has recorded five podium finishes in women's World Cup slalom events, but has yet to win one. The last German woman to win a World Cup slalom event was Maria Höfl-Riesch who won in Levi on 10 November 2012.



- **Camille Rast** could claim her first podium finish in a World Cup slalom event. She finished sixth in Flachau in 2021, when her compatriot Wendy Holdener finished third. Holdener is the only Swiss woman to have claimed podium finishes here in the slalom event: third in 2017 and 2021.
- **Paula Moltzan** hopes to become the first USA woman not named Shiffrin or Vonn to win a World Cup event since Alice Mckennis Duran in a downhill on 12 January 2013 in St. Anton am Arlberg.
