

PREVIEW MEN'S SUPER G LAKE LOUISE – Saturday 26 Nov 2022

Aleksander Aamodt Kilde

- Aleksander Aamodt Kilde won his second super-G crystal globe last season, after winning it for the first time in 2015/16. He can join Aksel Lund Svindal (5), Hermann Maier (5), Pirmin Zurbriggen (4) and Kjetil Jansrud (3) in winning this trophy in at least three seasons.
- Kilde has won seven super-G World Cup events, joint-most alongside Vincent Kriechmayr among active male skiers.
- Kilde's best result in a super-G World Cup in Lake Louise is a fourth place in 2017. Norwegian men have won the super-G here a record nine times.

Marco Odermatt

- Marco Odermatt won the overall World Cup and the giant slalom crystal globe last season. His seven wins in World Cup events in 2021/22 were only matched by Aleksander Aamodt Kilde (7).
- Odermatt won the opening World Cup event in this season, the men's giant slalom in Sölden on 23 October.
- Odermatt has won four super-G World Cup events in his career, third-most among Swiss men, behind Pirmin Zurbriggen (10) and Didier Cuche (6).
- Odermatt has yet to finish on the podium of a World Cup super-G in Lake Louise. His best result here was a seventh place in December 2019.

Other contenders

- **Matthias Mayer** has almost won as many Olympic gold medals in the super-G (2, 2018 and 2022) as he has won World Cup events in this discipline (3).
- His most recent World Cup win in a super-G event was in Lake Louise on 1 December 2019. His other wins were in Saalbach-Hinterglemm (February 2015) and Kitzbühel (January 2017).
- Hermann Maier (4) is the only Austrian to have won multiple super-G World Cups in Lake Louise.
- **Vincent Kriechmayr** has won seven super-G World Cup events, second-most among Austrian men, behind Hermann Maier (24). He finished second (2018) and third (2019) in the super-G in Lake Louise and with a win here he would become the first man to have claimed all three podium places in a super-G in Lake Louise.
- **Dominik Paris** can also achieve three different podium finishes in the Lake Louise super-G World Cup, after a third place in 2014 and second place in 2019. No Italian has won the super-G World Cup event here.
- At the start of this season, **Beat Feuz** was equal alongside Didier Cuche on 55 World Cup podiums in the two speed events downhill and super-G. The only men to have claimed more podium finishes in these events were Hermann Maier (63), Aksel Lund Svindal (62) and Stephan Eberharter (62).



- Three Canadian men finished on the podium in World Cup speed events last season: a win for **Cameron Alexander** in the downhill in Kvitfjell on 4 March (shared win alongside Niels Hintermann), a second place for **James Crawford** in the super-G in Kvitfjell on 6 March and a third place for **Broderick Thompson** in the super-G in Beaver Creek on 2 December.
- The Canadian men to have won the super-G World Cup in Lake Louise are John Kucera in 2006 and Manuel Osborne-Paradis in 2009.
