

## PREVIEW WOMEN'S SUPER G VAL D'ISERE - Sunday 17 Dec 2023

## Lara Gut-Behrami

- Lara Gut-Behrami finished third in the first super-G event of the 2023/24 World Cup season, in St. Moritz on 8 December.
- Gut-Behrami has won 19 women's super-G World Cup events, second-most behind Lindsey Vonn (28).
- Gut-Behrami claimed one of her 19 super-G wins in the World Cup in Val d'Isère, on 18 December 2016.
- Only Katja Seizinger (3), Hilde Gerg (2) and Alexandra Meissnitzer (2) have recorded multiple World Cup super-G wins at this resort among women.

## Sofia Goggia

- Sofia Goggia won the opening super-G event this World Cup season, in St. Moritz on 8 December. She has won the first super-G event of the season for the second time in her career, after 2021/22 (Lake Louise).
- The last woman to win the first two super-G events of a World Cup season was Mikaela Shiffrin in 2018/19.
- Goggia won the most recent super-G World Cup event in Val d'Isère, on 19
  December 2021. Katja Seizinger (on 2 and 4 February 1996) is the only
  woman to have celebrated back-to-back super-G victories in the World Cup
  at this resort.
- Goggia had not recorded a podium finish in a World Cup super-G event between her wins in Val d'Isère (December 2021) and St. Moritz (December 2023).

## Other contenders

- On 8 December, Cornelia Hütter finished second in the first super-G event of the 2023/24 World Cup season. Hütter recorded her first-ever podium finish in a World Cup event 10 years ago in Val d'Isère, a third place in the downhill on 21 December 2013.
- Marta Bassino is the reigning world champion in this event. On 8 February 2023, she won the title ahead of Mikaela Shiffrin (silver), Cornelia Hütter and Kajsa Vickhoff Lie (shared bronze medal).
- Bassino has yet to win a super-G event in the World Cup. She recorded two second places and two third places.
- Mikaela Shiffrin has won a record 91 World Cup events (excluding the Val d'Isère downhill). Of her 91 wins, five were claimed in the super-G.
- Shiffrin's only World Cup participation in this discipline in Val d'Isère was a fifth place in December 2021.
- Federica Brignone (8) can surpass Hilde Gerg (8) to become outright seventh on the list of women's World Cup super-G winners. Michaela Dorfmeister is sixth on 10 wins.
