

PREVIEW WOMEN'S EVENTS OSLO – Thursday 7 March & Saturday 9 March 2024

Ida Marie Hagen

- Ida Marie Hagen has won seven individual World Cup events this season. She had never won an individual World Cup event prior to this season.
- Hagen can secure the crystal globe for this World Cup season. She would be the third woman to win the overall World Cup classification, after Tara Geraghty-Moats (2020/21) and Gyda Westvold Hansen (2021/22 and 2022/23).
- Hagen is the first woman to have finished on the podium in each of the first 13 individual World Cup events of a season (7 wins, 6 second places).
- Norwegian women have won all 13 individual World Cup events this season, and they claimed 33 of the 39 podium spots.
- Norway has won 30 of the 32 individual women's World Cup events in Nordic combined. USA (win by Tara Geraghty-Moats) and Japan (win by Anju Nakamura) won one event each.

Gyda Westvold Hansen

- Gyda Westvold Hansen won four individual World Cup events this season, including the first three events. Last season, Hansen won all 10 World Cup events.
- Hansen won all seven individual World Cup events on Norwegian snow, including last season's event in Oslo.
- Hansen has finished on the podium in 29 of the 32 individual women's World Cup events. The three exceptions were her DNF in Schonach on 12 March 2022, a fifth place in Schonach on 27 January 2024 and her fourth place in Seefeld on 2 February 2024.

Other contenders

- Norway claimed 33 of the 39 podium places in this season's women's
 World Cup. The exceptions were third places by Finland's Minja Korhonen
 (Ramsau am Dachstein, 15 December), Austria's Lisa Hirner (Ramsau am
 Dachstein, 16 December), Germany's Nathalie Armbruster (Schonach, 27
 January and Seefeld 2 & 3 February) and a second place by Japan's
 Haruka Kasai (Otepää on 10 February).
- **Armbruster** has the most podium finishes in individual World Cup events without winning an event (10; 2 second places, 8 third places).
- Haruka Kasai finished fourth in each of the last three individual World Cup events in Norway, including last season's event in Oslo. Her only podium finish this season was in Otepää on 10 February (second place).
- Mari Leinan Lund (2) is the only woman besides Hagen and Hansen to win an individual World Cup event this season. Lund won events in Oberstdorf and Schonach.





• Lund finished on the podium in seven of the last nine individual World Cup events (2 wins, 3 second places, 2 third places).
