

PREVIEW MIXED TEAM EVENT OTEPÄÄ – Friday 6 Jan 2023

- This will be the second Nordic combined mixed team World Cup event. The first event was held on 7 January 2022 in Val di Fiemme.
- On 7 January 2022, Norway emerged victorious in the first mixed team event, finishing ahead of Austria and Germany in second and third place respectively.
- Austria had to settle for second place in Val di Fiemme in January last year, despite their lead after the second exchange in the cross country relay.
- This will be the 50th team event in the Nordic combined World Cup. Norway won 24 of the first 49 team events (men/mixed).
- Norway (G24-S9-B9) and Germany (G14-S22-B6) lead in most podium finishes in World Cup team events (42 each). Austria (G3-S9-B13) is third on 25 podium finishes in World Cup team events.
- Since the start of 2019/20, Norway won seven of the eight World Cup team events. The exception was when Eric Frenzel and Fabian Rießle won the men's team event for Germany on 16 January 2021. Norway finished fifth and sixth in that event.
- Jørgen Graabak was part of 21 of Norway's 24 wins in World Cup team events, including each of the last 20.
- Graabak's 21 team wins makes him the most prolific team member in history of the Nordic combined World Cup team events. Germany's Eric Frenzel follows on 11 wins.
