

PREVIEW WOMEN'S EVENTS SEEFELD - Friday 2 February 2024 - Saturday 3 February 2024

Anniversary

• FIS celebrates its 100th anniversary on the day of this event. The international federation was founded on 2 February 1924 in Chamonix.

Ida Marie Hagen

- Ida Marie Hagen has won three individual World Cup events this season. She had never won an individual World Cup event prior to this season.
- Hagen is the only woman to have finished on the podium in all eight individual World Cup events this season (three wins, five second places).
- Hagen (3 wins) has joined Gyda Westvold Hansen (20) as the only women on more than two individual World Cup victories. This will be the 28th individual World Cup event on the women's side.
- Norwegian women have won all eight individual World Cup events this season, and they claimed 21 of the 24 podium spots.
- Norway has won 25 of the 27 individual women's World Cup events in Nordic combined. USA (win by Tara Geraghty-Moats) and Japan (win by Anju Nakamura) won one event each.
- Hagen finished third and fifth respectively in the previous two individual women's World Cup events in Seefeld (27 and 28 January 2023).

Gyda Westvold Hansen

- Gyda Westvold Hansen failed to win any of the last five individual World Cup events (2nd-3rd-2nd-5th-3rd). She had won 20 of the 22 events prior to this streak.
- Hansen finished on the podium in 25 of the 27 individual World Cup events on the women's side. The two exceptions were her DNF in Schonach on 12 March 2022 and a fifth place in Schonach on 27 January 2024.
- Hansen won both individual World Cup events in Seefeld last year.

Other contenders

- Norway claimed 21 of the 24 podium places in the women's World Cup. The exceptions were third places by Minja Korhonen (Ramsau am Dachstein, 15 December), Lisa Hirner (Ramsau am Dachstein, 16 December) and Nathalie Armbruster (Schonach, 27 January).
- Mari Leinan Lund finished on the podium in six of the eight individual World Cup events this season (two wins, one second place and three third places). Lund came seventh in Ramsau am Dachstein on both days.
- Lund's two individual World Cup victories were achieved in 2024: in Oberstdorf on 13 January and Schonach on 27 January.
- Nathalie Armbruster is the woman to have recorded the most individual World Cup podium results without winning once (two second places, six third places). She finished on the podium in both individual World Cup events in Seefeld last year (runner-up and third respectively).
- Austria's best result in an individual women's World Cup event was a second place by Lisa Hirner in Ramsau am Dachstein on 16 December 2022.
- Yuna Kasai and her twin sister Haruka Kasai will celebrate their 20th birthday this weekend (on Sunday 4 February). The twin sisters have yet to claim a podium result in this season's World Cup (Haruka finished fourth in five of the eight individual events).
