

## PREVIEW WOMEN'S INDIVIDUAL LARGE HILL SAPPORO – 7-8 Jan 2023

### Eva Pinkelnig

- Eva Pinkelnig is leading the overall World Cup standings, having won four of the nine individual World Cup events this season.
- Pinkelnig has finished on the podium in eight of the nine individual World Cup events this season, with as exception a seventh place in Titisee-Neustadt.
- Pinkelnig won the most recent individual World Cup event in Sapporo, on 12 January 2020. She finished third in the event one day earlier. Both were large hill events.

### Other contender

- **Sara Takanashi** has won a record 63 individual World Cup events and claimed 113 podium finishes.
- Takanashi has won a record six individual World Cup events in Sapporo, but not since 2016. All of her wins in Sapporo were in normal hill events.
- Takanashi's last individual World Cup win was in the large hill event in Oslo in March 2022.
- **Anna Odine Strøm** claimed her first individual World Cup win in the first event in Ljubno on 31 December 2022. Her only podium finish in a large hill World Cup event was a second place in Lillehammer this season.
- **Maren Lundby** (10) is the woman to have won the most individual World Cup events on the large hill. She won a large hill event in Sapporo in January 2019, a year after she won both normal hill events here.
- Lundby's last podium finish in an individual World Cup event was when she won the large hill event in Lillehammer on 10 March 2020.
- **Silje Opseth** and **Katharina Althaus** have each won three individual World Cup events in large hill events. Lundby (10), Takanashi (9) and Sara Marita Kramer (9) are the women to have won more individual World Cup large hill events.
- **Sara Marita Kramer** (15) is one short of moving joint-third alongside Daniela Iraschko-Stolz (16) for most individual World Cup wins by a female ski jumper. The top two are Takanashi (63) and Lundby (30).
- **Selina Freitag** hopes to join her brother Richard Freitag (8 wins) as winner of an individual World Cup event. Richard's best result in Sapporo was a fifth place in January 2016.
- **Alexandria Loutitt** could become the second Canadian woman on the podium of an individual World Cup event, after Taylor Henrich claimed third-place finishes in Oberstdorf (normal hill) and Oslo (large hill) in January and March 2015.
- No **Slovenian woman** has won an individual World Cup event in Sapporo. It claimed a third place (Špela Rogelj 2015) and a second place (Ema Klinc 2016), both in normal hill events.
