

PREVIEW WOMEN'S INDIVIDUAL LARGE HILL WISLA – Saturday 5 Nov 2022

Sara Marita Kramer

- Sara Marita Kramer won the 2021/22 overall World Cup, becoming the second Austrian female ski jumper to claim the overall crystal globe, after Daniela Iraschko-Stolz in 2014/15.
- Kramer can become the third female ski jumper to claim multiple overall World Cups, after Sara Takanashi (4) and Maren Lundby (3).
- Before missing the Beijing 2022 Olympic Winter Games due to a positive COVID-19 test, Kramer had won 11 of the 15 previous World Cup events she started in, only missing the podium once in those 15 events (4th place in Nizhny Tagil). After the Olympic Games, she claimed only two wins and one second place in nine appearances in World Cup events.
- Kramer has equalled Iraschko-Stolz (both 19) on the most World Cup event wins amongst Austrian women. Only Takanashi (66) and Lundby (32) have claimed more World Cup wins among women than the Austrian pair.
- Kramer won the opening event in the last two seasons, in Ramsau am Dachstein in 2020/21 and in Nizhny Tagil in 2021/22. She can become the first woman to win three season openers in a row.

Sara Takanashi

- Sara Takanashi has won the overall World Cup a record four times: in 2012/13, 2013/14, 2015/16 and 2016/17. She can become the first ski jumper, male or female, to win the overall World Cup five times. Matti Nykänen and Adam Malysz won the men's overall World Cup four times.
- Takanashi has claimed 66 World Cup wins (all events), at least 34 more than any other female ski jumper (Maren Lundby 32).
- Takanashi is the only ski jumper to win at least one World Cup event in all of the 11 previous women's World Cup seasons (2011/12-2021/22).
- Takanashi has won the first World Cup event of the season a record four times, most recently in Lillehammer in 2016/17. All four times Takanashi won the season opener, she went on and claim the overall World Cup that season.
- Takanashi has won World Cup events in 11 of the 13 different countries in which women's World Cup events have been held. She has only failed to win in France (2nd and 3rd place in December 2018) and Italy (did not compete).

Other contenders

- The women's ski jumping World Cup will have an event in Poland for the first time.
- Urša Bogataj and Sara Marita Kramer (both 11) claimed the most individual podium results in the 2021/22 women's World Cup. This included three wins for Bogotaj and seven for Kramer.





- Since winning the women's normal hill event at the Beijing 2022 Olympic Winter Games, Urša Bogataj finished on the podium in seven of the nine World Cup events she participated in. The only exceptions in this run were a disqualification in Hinzenbach on 27 February and a fourth-place finish in Oslo on 5 March.
- Bogataj won the last two World Cup events of last season, the normal hill events in Oberhof (12 and 13 March). Last season, Sara Marita Kramer won four successive World Cup events in December 2021.
- Bogataj can become the first female Slovenian ski jumper to record three successive World Cup event wins.
- Nika Križnar (2nd in the 2021/22 overall World Cup) and her compatriot
 Ursa Bogataj can become the second Slovenian woman to win the season
 opener of a World Cup season, after Špela Rogelj in Lillemhammer in
 2014/15.
- Križnar won the overall World Cup in 2020/21. She can become the third female ski jumper to claim multiple overall World Cups, after Sara Takanashi (4) and Maren Lundby (3).
- Bogataj (1st) and Križnar (2nd) have finished 1-2 in the last two World Cup events. The exact same 1-2 finish occurred in three successive women's World Cup events on two occasions: Sarah Hendrickson (1st) and Sara Takanashi (2nd) in February-March 2012, and Chiara Kreuzer (1st) and Maren Lundby (2nd) in February 2020.
- Maren Lundby is set to make her return to the World Cup circuit in Wisla. Her last World Cup event was in Râsnov on 19 February 2021 (5th place).
- Lundby has won the overall World Cup three times (2017/18-2019/20). She can equal Sara Takanashi, Matti Nykänen and Adam Malysz on a record four overall World Cup wins (male or female).
- Only Takanashi (66) has won more World Cup events than Lungby (32) among female ski jumpers. Lungby's last World Cup victory dates back to 10 March 2020, when she won the individual large hill event in Lillehammer.
- **Polish women** are yet to record a podium finish in a World Cup event. The best result by a female Polish ski jumper is a sixth place by Kinga Rajda, in Oberstdorf in February 2020.
