

PREVIEW WOMEN'S INDIVIDUAL LARGE HILL WILLINGEN – Saturday 3 Feb 2024

Nika Prevc

- Nika Prevc won six out of a possible 13 individual women's World Cup events this season coming into Willingen.
- Prevc (6) could be the first woman aged 18 or younger to achieve over six individual World Cup wins in a season since Sara Takanashi's 15 wins in 2013/14.
- Prevc (6) can match Robert Kranjec (7) in joint-third place for the most individual World Cup wins among Slovenian ski jumpers (male or female).
 Nika's brother Peter Prevc (23) and Primož Peterka (15) make up the top-2.
- Peter Prevc (10 January 2016) and Nika Križnar (30 January 2022) are the only Slovenian winners of an individual World Cup event in Willingen.

Eva Pinkelnig

- Eva Pinkelnig finished first or second in six of her last eight individual World Cup participations (three wins, three second places), with an eight place in Sapporo and a ninth place in Zao as the exceptions.
- Pinkelnig (3) can win more than three individual World Cup events in a single season for the second time, after she recorded six wins last season.
- Pinkelnig recorded only two individual World Cup podium finishes in Germany, but she won the most recent one (Oberstdorf on 1 January 2024).

Other contenders

- Yuki Ito (2) can win more than two individual World Cup events in a single season for the second time, after winning five individual World Cup events in 2016/2017.
- Ito or **Nika Križnar** can become the first woman with more than one individual World Cup win in Willingen.
- Alexandria Loutitt (4th, 3rd, 3rd, 4th) is the only woman with a top-4 finish in each of the last four women's individual World Cup events.
- Loutit and Abigail Strate are seeking to become the first Canadian woman to win an individual World Cup event in Germany. The Canadian women to finish on the podium in Germany are Taylor Henrich (once) and Strate (three times).
- **Joséphine Pagnier** finished on the podium in the first three women's individual World Cup events of this season, but failed to reach the podium since.
- Sara Takanashi recorded top-11 finishes in each of the last seven individual women's World Cup events. The last two of her 115 WC podium finishes came in Willingen in February 2023.





- Katharina Schmid recorded three individual World Cup podium finishes in Willingen (including a win on 4 February 2023), that is more than any other woman.
- Schmid (49) is one short of recording her 50th individual World Cup podium finish.
