Normal World Cup points for each competition. The athlete with the highest amount of World Cup points from all three events is the tour winner.

13.01. – Individual, 1 jump & 10 km 14.01. - Compact, 1 jump & 7.5 km

Schonach (GER)

27.01. - Individual, 1 jump & 10 km 28.01. - Individual, 1 jump & 10 km

Overall ranking is based on the total results of all events. Top 3 Overall athletes, who participated in all four events, will receive extra prize money.

Nordic Combined TRIPLE - 02. - 04.02.24, Seefeld (AUT)

02.02. – Individual, 1 jump & 7.5 km cross-country 03.02. – Individual, 1 jump & 10 km cross-country

04.02. - Final Individual, 1 jump & 12.5 km cross-country

The athletes will receive fixed points after Day 1 results and bring them to Day 2, the same for Day 3. The first athlete crossing the finish line on Day 3 is the TRIPLE winner.

World Cup points

Athletes will be able to score up to 2100 points in the World Cup, taking all individual competitions into consideration

Trophies The Best Jumper and Best Skier Trophy leader will wear a bib with a blue

and red mark instead of a start number and will also receive prize money at

the end of the season. If an athlete owns two bibs at the same time, the lower ranked bib will be worn by the second placed athlete in the respective ranking.

For the first time, a mini crystal globe will be given to the best athlete of the Individual Compact format, at the end of the season.

Prize money at Team/Team Sprint events: 36.000 CHF (Top 3/6 teams)

Individual World Cup win: 9.000 CHF Team World Cup win: 19.000 CHF Team Sprint World Cup win: 14.500 CHF
