Maximum of one (1) Ski Jumping Team Competition team per NOC composed of one (1) male and one (1) female Ski Jumper and one (1) male and one (1) female Nordic Combined athlete who have already qualified, totalling four (4) athletes. The selection of the athletes in the Ski Jumping Team Competition is at the discretion of the NOC.

Maximum of one (1) Nordic Team Event team per NOC composed of one (1) male and (1) female Cross-Country skier, one (1) male and (1) female Ski Jumper and one (1) male and one (1) female Nordic Combined athlete who have already qualified, totalling six (6) athletes. The selection of the athletes in the Nordic Team Event is at the discretion of the NOC.

B.3. TYPE OF ALLOCATION OF QUOTA PLACES:

The quota place(s) is/are allocated to the NOC by discipline and gender and not by event.

C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors), and only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate in the Winter Youth Olympic Games.

C.1. AGE REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible to participate in the Lausanne 2020 Youth Olympic Games, athletes must have been born between 1 January 2002 and 31 December 2004.

C.2. ADDITIONAL IF REQUIREMENTS:

Athletes must have also participated in FIS level or Continental Cup competitions.

D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

<u>D.1, D.2, D.3, D.4, D.5</u> Men: 40 Women: 40	D.1 All NOCs ranked in the Marc Hodler Trophy Ski Jumping standings at the FIS Junior Nordic World Ski Championships 2019 (WJC 2019) and the Host Country are entitled to a quota of two (2) male and two (2) female athletes.
	D.2 Any remaining quota places will be distributed with a maximum of one (1) athlete, according to the NOCs ranked in the Ski Jumping individual event at the WJC 2019, not yet qualified according to D.1, until the maximum quota of 40 men and 40 women is reached.
	D.2.1 If there is a tie for the final allocated quota place(s) in the male and/or female Ski Jumping individual event at the WJC 2019, the NOC with the better ranked athlete from the YOG age group athletes on the 2018/19 Ski Jumping Continental Cup standings will be ranked ahead.
	D.3 In the event that there are remaining quota places thereafter, quota places will be allocated with a maximum of one (1) male and/or one (1) female athlete per NOC, to the NOCs not qualified from D.1 and D.2 that have indicated interest for a quota place(s) according to the men's and women's Ski Jumping Continental Cup 2018/2019 YOG age group athletes' standings.
	D.3.1 If there is a tie for the final allocated quota place(s) on either the men and/or women standings of the YOG age group athletes in the Ski Jumping Continental Cup 2018/19, the athlete with the higher number of first places, second places, third places, etc. at the 2018/19 Ski Jumping Continental Cup competitions will be ranked ahead.
	D.4 In the event that there are still remaining quota places thereafter, they will be allocated with a maximum of one (1) athlete per gender, to the NOC based on the

	men's and women's YOG age group athletes standings from the 2018/19 Ski Jumping FIS Cup to NOCs not qualified according to D.1, D.2 and D.3 that have indicated interest for a quota place.
D.4.1	If there is a tie for the final allocated quota place(s) on either the men and/or women standings of the YOG age group athletes in the Ski Jumping FIS Cup 2018/19, the athlete with the higher number of first places, second places, third places, etc. places at the 2018/19 Ski Jumping FIS Cup competitions will be ranked ahead.
D.5	In the event that there are remaining quota places thereafter, the allocation will continue according to D.2, D.3 and D.4 to NOCs that has indicated interest for a quota place(s), according to their second (2 nd) best ranked athlete, allowing a maximum of two (2) men and two (2) women quota places per NOC until all quota places are filled.
D.6	The FIS quota allocation list published on 9 December 2019 on the FIS website, <i>www.fis-ski.com</i> , will contain the NOCs who have been allocated quota place(s) based on D.1 – D.4.
D.7	In the event of cancellation of the WJC 2019, the allocation of D.1 and D.2 will be allocated based on the 2018/19 Ski Jumping FIS Cup Nation standings.
D.8	If the athlete earns a quota for the NOC in the Ski Jumping Continental Cup Standings (D.3), this athlete will not be considered when allocating quotas through the Ski Jumping FIS Cup Standings (D.4).

HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The Host Country is allocated a quota of two (2) men and two (2) women, as detailed in **D.1**. The selection of the athletes is at the discretion of the Host NOC while respecting the eligibility criteria detailed in **C. Athlete Eligibility**.

E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

FIS shall inform the NOCs that earn quota places through **D.1** and **D.2** on 30 June 2019 via the FIS website. The NOCs will then have two (2) weeks until 14 July 2019 to confirm via the FIS online system if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in **G. Qualification Timeline**.

For any quota places an NOC wishes to receive following the initial quota confirmation in July, NOCs must express their quota interest via the FIS online system before 5 October 2019. FIS will confirm the quotas to the NOCs that has expressed interest for the quotas(s) and earned quota places through **D.3** (and **D.4** and **D.5** if applicable) on 9 December 2019 via the FIS website.

F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

Any allocated quota places that the NOCs have not expressed interest for, or are returned/not confirmed by the respective NOC, will be reallocated by FIS based on the criteria described in **D.3** followed by **D.4** and if required, **D.5**.
