

PREVIEW WOMEN'S SUPER-G BANSKO – Sunday 26 Jan 2020

Sofia Goggia

- Sofia Goggia won the most recent super-G race in the World Cup, in St. Moritz on 14 December. It was her third World Cup race win in this discipline.
- Goggia (3) is one shy of the Italian women's record for most super-G wins in the World Cup, held by Karen Putzer (4). Goggia now shares second place with Isolde Kostner (3).
- Goggia can become the second Italian woman to win multiple super-G races in a World Cup season, after Putzer (2) in 2002/03.
- The only time Italian women won successive World Cup super-G events was in December 1999, when Kostner won in Val d'Isère before Putzer triumphed in St. Moritz.

Italy

- Nicol Delago (Lake Louise) and Federica Brignone (St. Moritz) claimed second places in the super-G this World Cup season.
- Compatriot Sofia Goggia won in St. Moritz, the most recent super-G in the World Cup. The only time Italian women won successive World Cup super-G events was in December 1999, when Isolde Kostner won in Val d'Isère before Karen Putzer triumphed in St. Moritz.
- Only Putzer (4), Goggia (3) and Kostner (3) have won more World Cup super-G races among Italian women than Brignone (2).
- Delago can become the eighth Italian woman to win a super-G in the World Cup.

Viktoria Rebensburg

- Viktoria Rebensburg won two of the last three super-G races in the World Cup, in Soldeu on 14 March and in Lake Louise on 8 December.
- Rebensburg can become the first German woman to win multiple super-G events in a World Cup season since Hilde Gerg (2) in 2001/02.
- The only German women to have claimed more World Cup super-G wins than Rebensburg (4) are Katja Seizinger (16), Gerg (8) and Marina Kiehl (6).

Other contenders

- Coming into Bansko, **Mikaela Shiffrin** has won 64 World Cup races, ranking her in second place on the all-time women's list. Lindsey Vonn holds the women's record of 82 race wins.
- On the men's side, only Ingemar Stenmark (86) and Marcel Hirscher (67) won more World Cup races.

- Shiffrin has won four of the last seven major super-G races she participated in: the World Cups in Lake Louise, St. Moritz and Cortina d'Ampezzo, and at the world championships in Åre.
- **Tina Weirather** has won seven career World Cup super-G races, as many as Alexandra Meissnitzer. She needs one more win to equal Hilde Gerg (8) in seventh place on the all-time women's list.
- Weirather has collected 21 World Cup podiums in the super-G, one shy of Anna Veith (22) in sixth place on the all-time women's list.
- Weirather finished second in the Bansko super-G on 26 February 2012.
- **Corinne Suter** claimed third place in the Lake Louise super-G, her first World Cup podium in this discipline. Last season, she won bronze in this discipline at the world championships.
- The last Swiss woman to win a World Cup super-G race was Lara Gut-Behrami in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 21 January 2018.
- **Gut-Behrami** has won 12 World Cup races in the super-G, equal to Carole Merle in joint-fourth place among women. Only Lindsey Vonn (28), Renate Götschl (17) and Katja Seizinger (16) have won more.
