

## PREVIEW WOMEN'S SUPER-G GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN – Sunday 9 Feb 2020

### Federica Brignone

- Federica Brignone won the super-G in Sochi last week. It was her 14th World Cup victory in all disciplines. The only Italian women to have won more World Cup events are Deborah Compagnoni (16) and Isolde Kostner (15).
- Coming into the Garmisch-Partenkirchen races, Mikael Shiffrin (6) is the only woman to have won more World Cup events in 2019/20 than Brignone (4). Petra Vlhová has also won four World Cup events this season.
- On four victories, the 2019/20 season is already Brignone's most successful campaign (3 wins in 2016/17 and 3 in 2017/18).
- Brignone could win successive super-G World Cup events for the first time.

### Italy

- Sofia Goggia won the super-G in St. Moritz this season, her third victory in a super-G World Cup event.
- Only Karen Putzer (4) has won more super-G World Cup events among Italian women than Goggia (3) and Federica Brignone (3). Isolde Kostner also won three super-G World Cups.
- Nicol Delago and Marta Bassino can become the eighth Italian woman to win a super-G in the World Cup.
- Coming into Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Italian women have won seven World Cup events. Only in 1996/97 (10) they won more combined.

### Lara Gut-Behrami

- Lara Gut-Behrami has won 12 World Cup races in the super-G, equal to Carole Merle in joint-fourth place among women. Only Lindsey Vonn (28), Renate Götschl (17) and Katja Seizinger (16) have won more.
- Gut-Behrami is the last Swiss woman to have won a super-G World Cup, in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 21 January 2018.
- Gut-Behrami finished third place in Bansko, exactly one year after her last podium finish in a super-G World Cup event.
- Gut-Behrami has collected 21 World Cup podiums in the super-G, one shy of Anna Veith (22) in sixth place on the all-time women's list.
- Gut-Behrami has won the World Cup super-G in Garmisch-Partenkirchen two times (2016, 2017), one shy of Lindsey Vonn's women's record three super-G victories here.

## Other contenders

- **Tina Weirather** has won seven career World Cup super-G races, as many as Alexandra Meissnitzer. She needs one more win to equal Hilde Gerg (8) in seventh place on the all-time women's list.
- Weirather has collected 21 World Cup podiums in the super-G, one shy of Anna Veith (22) in sixth place on the all-time women's list.
- **Corinne Suter** claimed third place in the Lake Louise super-G, her first World Cup podium in this discipline. Last season, she won bronze in this discipline at the world championships.
- **Joana Hählen** finished third in the super-G in Sochi, her best results in the World Cup. She will be 28 years and 17 days old when the super-G will be held on 9 February. Only two Swiss women were older when they won their first World Cup event: Heidi Zurbriggen was 28-356 when she won the downhill in Kvitfjell on 6 March 1996, while Fränzi Aufdenblatten was 28-313 when she claimed victory in super-G in Val d'Isère on 20 December 2009.
