

PREVIEW MEN'S SUPER G – SAALBACH-HINTERGLEMM - Friday 14 Feb 2020

Kjetil Jansrud

- Kjetil Jansrud won the most recent super-G in the World Cup, in Kitzbühel. It was his 13th World Cup win in this discipline, third most among men behind Hermann Maier (24) and Aksel Lund Svindal (17).
- Jansrud could win successive World Cup super-G events for the second time, after a streak of three in December 2016.
- Jansrud is the only man to have won a super-G race in each of the last seven World Cup seasons.
- Jansrud can finish on three consecutive super-G podiums in the World Cup for the first time since a run of five from March to December 2016.
- Jansrud finished third in the most recent World Cup super-G held in Saalbach-Hinterglemm, on 22 February 2015.

Matthias Mayer & Vincent Kriechmayr

- Matthias Mayer and Vincent Kriechmayr have won three World Cup super-G races each.
- This season, Mayer won the Lake Louise super-G and Kriechmayr the Val Gardena super-G.
- Austrian men could win three super-G races in a World Cup season for the first time since 2010/11 (3), when Georg Streitberger, Michael Walchhofer and Hannes Reichelt each won once.
- Mayer won the most recent World Cup super-G event in Saalbach-Hinterglemm, on 22 February 2015. This was his first World Cup win in this discipline.

Aleksander Aamodt Kilde

- Aleksander Aamodt Kilde is the only man to have finished in the top eight in each of the last 10 World Cup super-G events, with his best result second places in Beaver Creek and Kitzbühel.
- Kilde's only super-G win in the World Cup came in Hinterstoder on 27 February 2016.
- Since his win in Hinterstoder in 2016, Kilde collected seven World Cup podiums in the super-G: four second and three third places.
- Kilde is ranked second place in the overall World Cup standings after the events in Chamonix, but has yet to win a World Cup race this season (excl. Saalbach-Hinterglemm downhill). No alpine skier, male or female, has ever won the overall World Cup without winning a single race.

Other contenders

- **Marco Odermatt** can become the first Swiss man to win multiple super-G races in a World Cup season since Beat Feuz (2) in 2011/12.
- **Mauro Caviezel** has claimed five World Cup super-G podiums, but has yet to collect his first victory in this discipline.
- **Thomas Dreßen** finished on two World Cup podiums in the super-G, two third places. He can become the third German man to win a super-G race in the World Cup, after Markus Wasmeier (6 wins) and Josef Ferstl (2).
- **US male skiers** have not recorded a World Cup super-G podium since Andrew Weibrecht's second place in Kitzbühel on 22 January 2016.
