

PREVIEW MEN'S SUPER-G KVITFJELL – Sunday 18 February 2024

Marco Odermatt

- Marco Odermatt (390) wins this season's super-G crystal globe if he finishes in first or second in this World Cup event or if his advantage over Vincent Kriechmayr (269) is more than 100 points after this event.
- Odermatt can become the first male skier to win the super-G crystal globe in successive season since Kjetil Jansrud (2016/17 and 2017/18). The only Swiss man to have topped this specific World Cup standings more than once was Pirmin Zurbriggen (four times).
- Odermatt (12) can match Kjetil Jansrud (13) in third place for most World Cup super-G wins. Hermann Maier (24) and Aksel Lund Svindal (17) top that list.
- Odermatt finished on the podium in 13 of the last 14 super-G World Cup events (8 wins, 3 second places and 2 third places). The exception is a fourth place in Garmisch-Partenkirchen on 27 January.
- Kvitfjell can become the 10th different resort in which Odermatt wins a World Cup super-G event. Only Hermann Maier (10) recorded World Cup super-G wins in at least 10 different resorts.
- Odermatt's results in World Cup super-G events in Kvitfjell: 14th (2019) and 28th (2022).

Other contenders

- **Vincent Kriechmayr** finished second in the World Cup super-G events in Kvitfjell in 2015 and 2016, but failed to finish on the podium in super-G events here since (2017, 2018, 2019, 2022).
- **Cyprien Sarrazin** and **Nils Allègre** can join Luc Alphand (2) and Franck Piccard (2) as the Frenchmen on multiple World Cup super-G wins.
- The best result by a Frenchman in the Kvitfjell super-G in the World Cup is a second place by Alphand in 1996.
- **Raphael Haaser** recorded second places in two of the last four super-G World Cup events (Bormio, Garmisch-Partenkirchen). Only Marco Odermatt (3) and Aleksander Aamodt Kilde (2) also recorded at least two WC super-G podium finishes in this period.
- **Guglielmo Bosca** finished third in the World Cup super-G event in Garmisch-Partenkirchen on 27 January to record his first career WC podium result. He has been competing in the World Cup since 2016.
- **James Crawford** is the reigning world champion in the men's super-G but has yet to win a World Cup event. His only podium finish in a World Cup super-G event was a second place in Kvitfjell on 6 March 2022.
- **Franjo von Allmen** recorded top 10 finishes in all super-G World Cup events he finished, including a third place in Garmisch-Partenkirchen on 28 January (9th, DNF, 9th, 3rd).
- **Loïc Meillard** has recorded 16 World Cup podium finishes, but only two of them came in speed events (downhill, super-G): two super-G third places, including one in Garmisch-Partenkirchen on 27 January.
