

TESTING PROTOCOL - AUTHORITY - DISCIPLINE

FIS World Cup Risk Management Covid-19 Testing Protocol

Objective: To minimise risk of Covid-19 within the FIS World Cup Snowflake

Authority: **National** Health **Regulations** are **decisive** in every country and arrange testing on-site. FIS Protocol does not define testing frequency, quarantine period/s, etc.

Discipline: Every person **must adhere** to the **policies**, follow procedures, instructions and **behave** in a **disciplined** manner at all times. **Breach** of discipline protocol will lead to **withdrawal** of **accreditation** and suspension of 14 days **quarantine** from participating at **FIS** World Cup or other level **event**/s



TESTING COSTS - EXECUTION - INFORMATION

Stakeholders and/or individual **persons** are **responsible** for own **costs** for own testing including **on-site** RT-PCR tests **arranged** by national health authorities

Test Execution carried out in accordance with best practice

Results Recording and Whereabouts Monitoring/Tracking
Compulsory registration in the central and GDPR compliant FIS C-19 Database to be
eligible for accreditation and establish each person's Covid-19 FIS Passport. Selfrecording of daily whereabouts country/ies and recording of testing dates.



POSITIVE C-19 - ACTIONS - COMMUNICATION

Covid-19 Positive Sample

A positive result is automatically reported to the national authorities and national procedures for action will be applied, generally a quarantine

Event Task Force and actions

One senior management representative from FIS, the LOC and NSA and the LOC Health Coordinator representing the national health authorities instruct the affected person of their obligations.

Communication

FIS Covid-19 **Communications Policy** aligned to national regulations for **privacy** and **tracing**



COVID-19 EXPERTISE - RESOURCES

Covid-19 Expertise - Local and FIS

National health authority coordinator has responsibility for implementation regulations per event and providing advise before and on site.

C-19 INFORMATION - EVENT AND FIS

LOC Event **Information** with Organisation **Plan** and Hygiene **Information** according to national regulations

Published by LOC and included with FIS Calendar link information per event

FIS Covid-19 Guidelines revised for winter edition, published September

- Updates include WHO feedback, UCI / other IF best practice, lessons learned
- On-line active: FAQs Online Community-Forum



C-19 LOC SET-UP – EXAMPLE: SJ WISLA

- 1. **Separation** of teams from spectators area in `technical` zone
- 2. Plexi shield for athletes protection: Exit / Cool-down area/s
- 3. **Disinfection** solutions and masks **available** in all key places
- 4. **Full-protection** Covid-19 equipment for all **medical** persons
- 5. **Isolation rooms** in every official place: Hotel/s, Ski Jumping venue
- 6. One ambulance dedicated for Covid cases
- 7. Athletes without **masks**: if necessary for warm-up and from technical control before jump until exit gate
- Education for athletes and spectators: main competition speaker, information, posters, team captains meeting, etc.
- 9. **Distance** control where necessary e.g. corridors athletes and media



OVERVIEW COVID-19 CALENDAR - PARTICIPATION

FIS policy in all disciplines: 70% of nations in top ten to be eligible to participate:

- Definition of implementation in regulations per discipline
- Cut-off deadline per discipline for 70% decision
- Subsequent changes to government restrictions managed as force majeure in Event Task Force

Eligibility requirement: access to organising country without quarantine and departure from organising country without quarantine (or minimal) to main hub: Schengen

National regulations generally mean the person's whereabouts during past 14 days and not their nationality/passport



FIS WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS 2021

FIS World Championships: Cortina 2021 / Oberstdorf 2021 / Zhangjiakou 2021 / Planica 2021

- Adapted and Downscaled
- Set-ups to prepare for required health measures
- Contributions of FIS and all Stakeholders for downscaling, e.g. Non-essential persons: guests, representatives, volunteers, etc.



OVERVIEW COVID-19 STATUS FOR 2020/2021

Beijing 2022 Test Events in 2021

- Major focus for Beijing 2022, IOC, NOCs and IFs in 2021 season
- Regular online meetings to monitor venue and event organisation updates and progress - on track
- International Winter Sports Federations closed official inspection
 November 2020
- Beijing 2022 and LOCs publishing information and attendance possibilities for all stakeholders





FIS OFFICIALS

- RT-PCR testing every 2-3 weeks or upon "valid reasons" (i.e. "Yes" to questions in the FIS Health Questionnaire)
- Blood antibodies screening every 2 months
- RT-PCR testing will otherwise be subject to the regulations of the national health authorities which are decisive.

LOCAL ORGANISING COMMITTEE: OFFICIALS, PERSONNEL, WORKFORCE, VOLUNTEERS

EVERY PERSON MUST MAKE THEIR OWN ARRANGEMENT TO HAVE AN UP-TO-DATE RT-PCR TEST
RESULT ON ARRIVAL AT THE EVENT, TO FACILITATE THEIR ACCREDITATION OR HAVE A VALID
ANTIBODY POSITIVE SEROLOGICAL BLOOD TEST BEFORE ARRIVAL AT THE EVENT – OR DOCUMENT A
SIMILAR OWN PREVENTION SET-UP PLAN APPROVED IN ADVANCE BY FIS



LOC RT-PCR testing during Event



Athletes, Team Support Staff, Equipment Service



Accredited Groups: Broadcasters, Rights Holders, Sponsors and Partners, Event Management, Timing & Data Service, Suppliers, Event Service Teams, etc.



Local Organising Committee: Officials, Personnel, Workforce, Volunteers

- Persons who have been in "Red Countries" within the previous 14 days
- Persons who answer "Yes" to any of the questions in the FIS "Health Questionnaire"
- 3. Persons returning to countries where a negative RT-PCR is mandatory for entry
- 4. RT-PCR testing will otherwise be subject to the regulations of the national health authorities which are decisive.
