

Change of rules season 2020-21 – Precisions

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION RULES

404.1.5 Further Qualification and Revocation

All licensed Jumping Judges must participate annually in either an international or a national update/certification course.

If either of the following occurs, the Judge may no longer officiate as a Jumping Judge at international competitions:

- The Judge cannot show proof of any judging assignments or activity.
- The Judge fails to participate in a certification course for Judges for a period of two consecutive years.

Reinstatement of the Judge's FIS license is possible after successfully completing an international Judges course and receiving a written recommendation from the national Obman and from the head instructor and by the confirmation of the Sub-Committee for Officials, Rules and Control.

Once Jumping Judges reach the age of ~~60~~ **65**, they are automatically retired as Jumping Judges. However, they may continue to function as a Jumping Judge for competitions ~~at "Continental Cup", "FIS Cup" and "International competition" level until 65 and~~ in their own Ski Associations at national-level competitions.

~~After reaching the age of 60 a Jumping Judge may apply in writing to the respective National Ski Association for prolongation up to the age of 65 for COC and WC. The Sub-Committee for Officials, Rules and Control in coordination with the National Ski Association has to decide annually regarding this qualification.~~

424 Training on the Jumping Hill before the Competition*

424.4 For FIS International competitions, ~~OWG and WSC~~, the jumping hills must be available for training for a minimum of one day/session. ~~For the OWG and the WSC, the jumping hill must be available for training three days before the competition.~~ The Competition Committee shall consider both snow and weather conditions when scheduling training sessions. It is the responsibility of the Competition Committee to provide optimal training conditions for all competitors.

451 International Championships on Normal and Large Hills*

451.2 The competition on the normal jumping hill should take place first. The competition dates have to be scheduled in such a way that all ~~three~~ training days/sessions, according to article 424.1 which are ~~also~~ required for ~~the second-all~~ jumping competitions, could only be used after the competition on the first jumping hill.

WORLD CUP RULES MEN

6.2.1 Accommodation

Room and full pension in a good hotel in the competition resort for the duration of the event, beginning one night before the first official training resp. the following night after the last competition. An invitation and information packet must be sent by the organiser to each National Ski Association. Participating teams must enter their competitors prior to the published entry deadline. By doing so, the team secures their required number of booked room reservations. For booked room reservation not used, the organiser has the right to demand a cancellation fee from the National Ski Associations (exception is a reduction of the number of athletes due to quota change). In case reimbursement of travel expenses for the nations concerned occur, the organiser has the right to deduct the cancellation fee directly from the reimbursement of the travel expenses. By no means is the organiser or the hotel manager allowed, without agreement of the team captain, to demand the vacating of the rooms on the day of the 13.07.2020 Rules FIS World Cup Ski Jumping Men 2020-2021 - 12 - competition. For nations with starting quota 4 or more two single rooms have to be provided. For competitors and officials not included in the quota, the Organising Committee has to provide competitors and officials accommodation and meals at least 25% below the normal price at the place in question, whereby CHF 125.— is the maximum price.

When an event program includes a team competition, all participating nations are allowed to enter up to a number of four (4) athletes. Accommodation for extra quota athletes (up to four) have to be provided by the Organizers for the entire duration of the competition (weekend and tournament).

Clarification of Equipment rules

Wedges (“Jets”):

The individual wedges used by athletes must be symmetrical with the thickness limited to 5,5 cm in the back, 1,5 cm on the side and 0,5 cm in front.

Jumping boots:

The pads inside the boot must have the same thickness on both sides.

Jumping suits Women:

The Women’s suit will have a new cutting from the hip and down. This change gives less seams and it will make it easier to produce (see the drawings in the enclosure). The new cutting-rule is valid from start of the World Cup season 2020-21. In summertime both the new cutting and the existing cutting are allowed due to keeping the cost-level down.

Jumping suit:

The lowest part of the crotch must be at the cross seams (see the pictures and drawings in the enclosure at the end).

4. Exceptions for the Competition Equipment for Category Youth I:

Bindings:

Only standard bindings can be used. No modification to the binding is allowed. If rod bindings are used, there must be a straight rod and a straight clip. The binding must be fixed to the ski parallel.

Jumping boots:

Only standard boots can be used. No modification with asymmetric parts is allowed.

Wedges („Jets“):

Only straight and symmetric wedges can be used.
