

#### FOUR HILLS TOURNAMENT - INNSBRUCK - 3 Jan 2021

### Dawid Kubacki

- Dawid Kubacki won the Four Hills Tournament last season, after being only victorious on the last hill in Bischofshofen.
- Kubacki's win Garmisch-Partenkirchen on 1 January was his second victory on a hill in the Four Hills Tournament.
- Among Polish ski jumpers, Kubacki (2) could surpass Malysz (2) on second-most wins in the Four Hills event, after Stoch (5).
- In each of the last five seasons, the winner of Garmisch-Partenkirchen also won in Innsbruck in the Four Hills Tournament.
- Marius Lindvik won on both hills in 2020, Ryoyu Kobayshi in 2019, Kamil Stoch in 2018, Daniel-André Tande in 2017 and Peter Prevc in 2016. Stoch is the only Polish ski jumper to have ever achieved it.
- Kubacki can become the third Polish ski jumper to win in Innsbruck in the Four Hills Tournament, after Adam Malysz (2001) and Stoch (2018).

# **Halvor Egner Granerud**

- Halvor Egner Granerud is leader in the overall standings of this season's Four Hills tournament, after he finished second in Garmisch-Partenkirchen on 1 January and recorded his first podium in a Four Hills event.
- The last Norwegian winner of the Four Hills tournament was Anders
  Jacobsen in 2007. Jacobsen was third in the classification after GarmischPartenkirchen. He then won in Innsbruck and took the lead in the
  standings.
- Overall World Cup leader Granerud has won five individual World Cup events this season, at least three more than any other male ski jumper.
- Granerud can become the 23rd Norwegian to win a Four Hills event. Only Austria (23) have had as many different winners.
- Norway has won 49 Four Hills events, second-most after Austria (63).
- Norwegian ski jumpers have won 13 times in Innsbruck. Only Finland has won here more often: 14.
- Norway has won 14 times in Garmisch-Partenkirchen (12 Bischofshofen, 10 Oberstdorf).

### **Kamil Stoch**

- Kamil Stoch has won five Four Hills events: Bischofshofen in 2016/17 and all four events in 2017/18. Among active jumpers, only Gregor Schlierenzauer (9) has won more events in the competition.
- Stoch (5) needs one more win to equal Helmuth Recknagel (6) and Sven Hannawald (6) in sixth-place all-time on most Four Hills event wins. Matti Nykänen (7) is in fifth place.
- Only Adam Malysz (12) has recorded more podium finishes among Polish ski jumpers in Four Hills events than Stoch (10).





- Stoch has won 36 individual World Cup events, the joint-fourth most all-time alongside Janne Ahonen (36). Only Schlierenzauer (53), Nykänen (46) and Malysz (39) have won more.
- Stoch can become the 11th ski jumper with multiple wins in Innsbruck and the first since Gregor Schlierenzauer recorded his second win in 2013.

## Other contenders

- Marius Lindvik won the event in Innsbruck last season. He will miss the event this year.
- **Piotr Zyla** will be 33 years and 353 days old on 3 January. Only one man was older when he won a Four Hills event: Sepp Bradl was 35y-363d in Bischofshofen in 1954 and 34y-364d in Innsbruck in 1953.
- Kamil Stoch (33y-223d in Innsbruck) can also become the second-oldest winner of a Four Hills event.
- Anže Lanišek can become the third ski jumper representing Slovenia to win in Innsbruck in the Four Hills Tournament after Peter Prevc (2016) and Peter Zonta (2004).
- Peter Prevc is also the last Slovenian to win or claim a podium in a Four Hills event, when he won in Bischofshofen in 2016.
- Karl Geiger won the first Four Hills Tournament event in Oberstdorf to claim his first ever win in the competition.
- The last German to win two of the Four Hills events was Sven Hannawald in 2001/02. He went on to win all Four Hills that season to become the first ever ski jumper to achieve that feat.
- Richard Freitag was the last German to win in Innsbruck when he won in 2015.
- **Daniel Huber** can become the first Austrian to win the Four Hills event in Innsbruck since Gregor Schlierenzauer in 2013.
- The last Austrian to win one of the Four Hill events was Stefan Kraft, when he won in Oberstdorf on 30 December 2016.
- Austrian ski jumpers have won 13 times in Innsbruck. Only Finnish ski jumpers (14) have won more often in Innsbruck.
- Austria can become the first country to have 11 different winners in Innsbruck in the Four Hills Tournament.
- **Japan** has won six times in Innsbruck, more than at any other hill in the Four Hills tournament.
- Japan has claimed 13 podium finishes in Innsbruck (G6-S0-B7). It also finished in the top-three 13 times in Garmisch-Partenkirchen (G5-S2-B6).
