

FOUR HILLS TOURNAMENT - BISCHOFSHOFEN - 6 Jan 2021

General

- In the last 21 seasons, only once the leader after the Innsbruck event failed to win the Golden Eagle - in 2016/17, Daniel-André Tande led after three events but was surpassed by Kamil Stoch and Piotr Zyla in the final event.
- Three different ski jumpers have won one Four Hills Tournament event this season. Karl Geiger won in Oberstdorf, Dawid Kubacki in Garmisch-Partenkirchen and Kamil Stoch in Innsbruck.
- This century, only twice, four different ski jumpers won a Four Hills Tournament event in a single season: 2002/03 and 2014/15.

Kamil Stoch

- Kamil Stoch can win the Four Hills Tournament for the third time after his wins in 2016/17 and 2017/18.
- Stoch can join Helmut Recknagel and Björn Wirkola in third place all-time among most wins in the Four Hills Tournament. Only Janne Ahonen (5) and Jens Weißflog (4) have won it more often.
- Stoch has won six Four Hills events: Bischofshofen in 2016/17, all four events in 2017/18 and Innsbruck this season. Among active jumpers, only Gregor Schlierenzauer (9) has won more events in the competition.
- With his win in Innsbruck, Stoch (6) equalled Helmuth Recknagel (6) and Sven Hannawald (6) in sixth-place all-time on most Four Hills event wins. Matti Nykänen (7) is in fifth place.
- Only Adam Malysz (12) has recorded more podium finishes among Polish ski jumpers in Four Hills events than Stoch (11).
- Stoch has won 37 individual World Cup events, the outright fourth most all-time. Only Schlierenzauer (53), Nykänen (46) and Malysz (39) have won more.

Dawid Kubacki

- Dawid Kubacki can become the first ski jumper to win back-to-back Four Hills Tournaments since Kamil Stoch won in both 2016/17 and 2017/18.
- Kubacki (and Stoch) can give Poland their fourth win in the last five editions. Only one Polish ski jumper had won the Four Hills Tournament before this run: Adam Malysz in 2001.
- Kubacki won the Four Hills Tournament last season, after being only victorious on the last hill in Bischofshofen. He has won in Garmisch-Partenkirchen this season.
- Among Polish ski jumpers, Kubacki (2) could surpass Malysz (2) on second-most wins in the Four Hills Tournament, after Stoch (6).
- Kubacki can record his 10th podium finish in a Four Hills event. With Malysz on 12 and Stoch on 11, he can become the third Polish jumper to reach double figures.

- Kubacki missed out the podium only once in his last eight Four Hills events, when he recorded a 15th place in Oberstdorf this season.

Halvor Egnér Granerud

- Halvor Egnér Granerud can become the first Norwegian ski jumper to win the Four Hills Tournament since Anders Jacobsen in 2007.
- Granerud can give Norway its 11th win in the Four Hills Tournament. Only Austria, Finland and Germany (including West and East Germany) have won it more often (all 16).
- Granerud can become the 23rd Norwegian to win a Four Hills event. Only Austria (also 23) have had as many different winners.
- Norway has won 49 Four Hills events, second-most after Austria (63).
- Overall World Cup leader Granerud has won five individual World Cup events this season, at least three more than any other male ski jumper.

Other contenders

- **Karl Geiger** won the first Four Hills Tournament event in Oberstdorf this season to claim his first ever win in the competition.
- The last German to win two of the Four Hills events was Sven Hannawald in 2001/02. He went on to win all Four Hills that season to become the first ever ski jumper to achieve that feat.
- The last German ski jumper to win the Four Hills Tournament was also Hannawald in 2001/02.
- **Anže Lanišek** can become the first ski jumper representing Slovenia to win a Four Hills event, since Peter Prevc won in Bischofshofen in 2016.
- **Piotr Zyla** will be 33 years and 356 days old on 6 January. Only one man was older when he won a Four Hills event: Sepp Bradl was 35y-363d in Bischofshofen in 1954 and 34y-364d in Innsbruck in 1953.
- **Daniel Huber** can become the first Austrian to win the Four Hills event in Bischofshofen since Michael Hayböck in 2015.
- Austrian jumpers won 23 times in Bischofshofen. No other hill has more than 14 wins from a single country.
