

PREVIEW WOMEN'S SUPER-G GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN – 31 January 2021

Lara Gut-Behrami

- Lara Gut-Behrami won the last two super-G events in the World Cup, in St. Anton am Arlberg on 10 January and in Crans-Montana on 24 January.
- Gut-Behrami can become the first woman to win three successive super-G races in the World Cup since she achieved this herself from December 2016 to January 2017.
- Only Lindsey Vonn (28), Renate Götschl (17) and Katja Seizinger (16) have won more women's super-G events in the World Cup than Gut-Behrami (14).
- Gut-Behrami claimed two World Cup wins in the super-G in Garmisch-Partenkirchen, in 2016 and 2017. Only Vonn (3) won the Garmisch-Partenkirchen super-G more often in the women's World Cup.
- Gut-Behrami only won more World Cup super-G races in Lake Louise (3) than in Garmisch-Partenkirchen (2).

Corinne Suter

- Corinne Suter finished on the podium in four of the last five super-G events in the World Cup, with the only exception a ninth place in Crans-Montana last week.
- Suter won the super-G in Garmisch-Partenkirchen last season, her only World Cup win in this discipline.
- Suter can join Lindsey Vonn (3) and Lara Gut-Behrami (2) as the only women on multiple World Cup super-G wins in Garmisch-Partenkirchen.

Italians

- **Federica Brignone** and **Sofia Goggia** (both 3) can equal Karen Putzer (4) for most World Cup super-G wins among Italian women.
- Coming into Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Brignone (15) is one shy of equalling the record of most World Cup wins among Italian women held by Deborah Compagnoni (16). Isolde Kostner also won 15 World Cup events.
- Goggia finished runner-up in the super-G in Garmisch-Partenkirchen in the 2018/19 World Cup. This is Italy's only World Cup super-G podium in Garmisch-Partenkirchen.
- **Marta Bassino** can become the third Italian woman to win both a giant slalom and super-G event in a single World Cup season, after Karen Putzer (2002/03) and Brignone (2015/16, 2017/18, 2019/20).
- Bassino has claimed two career super-G podiums in the World Cup, second places in Bansko (26 January 2020) and St. Anton am Arlberg (10 January 2021).
- **Elena Curtoni**'s best World Cup result in the super-G is a second place in Crans-Montana on 25 February 2017.

- Bassino and Curtoni could join seven Italian women on at least one World Cup super-G win. Only Austria (18), Switzerland (14) and Germany (10, including West Germany) have more different women's super-G winners in the World Cup.

Other contenders

- **Ester Ledecká** won the opening super-G event in the 2020/21 World Cup, in Val d'Isère on 20 December. This marked her first World Cup victory and podium place in this specific discipline.
- Coming into Garmisch-Partenkirchen, Ledecká is hoping to become the first Czech alpine skier, male or female, to win three World Cup events (including Czechoslovakia). She now shares the record of two with Šárka Strachová and Olga Charvátová.
- **Tamara Tippler** finished on the podium in a World Cup super-G race on six occasions but never won (2nd three times, 3rd three times). This equals the women's record of most podium places without ever winning in this discipline, held by Michaela Gerg-Leitner (1985-1991).
- **Petra Vlhová** has achieved 40 World Cup podiums in all disciplines, but none of them came in the super-G. Her best result in this discipline is a fourth place in La Thuile on 29 February 2020.
- **Michelle Gisin's** only World Cup podium in the super-G was a second place in St. Moritz on 9 December 2017.
- Gisin has already claimed podiums in the giant slalom and slalom this World Cup season (excluding Garmisch-Partenkirchen downhill), including her first career win (Semmering slalom).
