

PREVIEW MIXED TEAM WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS – Wednesday 17 Feb 2021

- **Austria** has won the team event a record three times at the world championships. The country was victorious in 2007, 2013 and 2015.
- Austria (G3-S3-B0) finished on the podium six of the seven times this event has been held at the world championships. The exception was a fifth place in 2017.
- Michaela Kirchgasser (G3-S1-B0) has won this event a record three times and shares the record of most medals in this event with Sweden's Maria Pietilä Holmner (G0-S1-B3).
- **France** (2) is the only country other than Austria to claim multiple world titles in this event. Tessa Worley was part of both of France's gold-medal winning teams.
- Worley finished either first (twice) or fifth (three times) in this event.
- **Switzerland** is the reigning world champion in the team event. Only Austria ever won the team event at consecutive world championships (2013-2015).
- Switzerland also won the first and only edition of the team event at the Olympic Games, in Pyeongchang in 2018.
- **Sweden** (G0-S2-B3) has claimed five medals in this event, but failed to win a gold medal. Only in 2005 (7th) and 2019 (5th) they missed out on a medal.
- **Germany** claimed the inaugural gold medal in this event in 2005. The team's only other podium in this event was a third place in 2013.
- **Italy** finished third in this event two years ago, claiming its first ever world championship medal in this event.
- Italy can become the third host country to claim a world championship medal in the team event, after Austria who won gold in Schladming in 2013 and Sweden who claimed silver in Åre 2007
