

PREVIEW MIXED TEAM LENZERHEIDE – Friday 19 Mar 2021

- The team event has been held at the World Cup Finals ever since the 2005/06 season, with the exception of 2007/08 when it was cancelled due to bad weather. In 2019/20, the World Cup Finals were cancelled due to the coronavirus crisis.
- **Switzerland** has won the team event a record four times at the World Cup Finals, including in Soldeu in 2018/19. Austria follows on three wins.
- Wendy Holdener is the only person to have won this event four times at the World Cup Finals as she was part of all four of Switzerland's winning teams.
- Only André Myhrer (7), Michaela Kirchgasser (6) and Mattias Hargin (6) have finished in the top-three more often in this event at the World Cup Finals than Holdener (5).
- Switzerland won the team event at the 2018 Olympic Games in Pyeongchang and at the 2019 world championships in Åre.
- **Norway's** three podium finishes in the team event at world level all came in the last three years. The Norwegians claimed bronze at the 2018 Olympic Games in Pyeongchang, finished second at the 2018/19 World Cup Finals in Soldeu and won the gold medal at the 2021 world championships in Cortina d'Ampezzo.
- Kristin Lysdahl and Sebastian Foss Solevåg were part of all three Norway teams to claim a podium at world level.
- **Austria** finished on the podium in eight of the previous 13 team events at the World Cup Finals, most of all countries (Sweden and Switzerland next on 7). Austria failed to reach the podium in 2013 and in the last four World Cup Finals.
- Austria achieved a record three gold medals and a joint record six total medals (also 6 by Sweden) in this event at the world championships.
- **Sweden** claimed seven podium finishes in the team event at the World Cup Finals, including a win in 2016/17 and 2017/18. Only Austria (8) has finished on more podiums in this event at the World Cup Finals.
- Sweden achieved six world championship medals in the team event, but failed to win the gold medal. Last month, the Swedes took the silver medal in Cortina d'Ampezzo.
- **Germany** finished in third place at last month's world championships, claiming its third medal in this event (2005 gold, 2013 bronze). Germany won the team event twice at the World Cup Finals, both in Lenzerheide (2010/11, 2012/13).
- Sweden and Germany could join Switzerland (4) and Austria (3) on at least three team wins at the World Cup Finals.
