

FIS Prevention Guidelines for season 2021/2022

Outcomes 2020-2021

- 2019-2020 season ended prematurely
- C-19 Support Group / FIS developed guidelines for prevention of transmission
- FIS Passport App
- Many events went ahead in 2020-2021 season, thanks to:
 - Great uptake by host resorts
 - Good understanding by all participants, with excellent adherence to general preventive measures and hygiene advice
 - Good adherence to separation of 'bubbles'



Outcome Season 2020-2021

- 100,000+ PCR test results recorded
- 105 positive cases (around 0.1%)


Daily new confirmed COVID-19 cases per million people



Major Changes since last season

- 1. A new understanding of the way the disease spreads
- 2. VACCINATION
- 3. Greater understanding of outcomes in children and young people
- 4. Long-term illness



New - How the disease spreads

- SARS-CoV-2 virus is spread in tiny particles (smaller than droplets) aerosols
- Spread via asymptomatic individuals
- Infectious before development of any symptoms
- Aerosols are generated by breathing, talking, singing, shouting, coughing

<u>Indoor Spaces</u> – MASKS & VENTILATION (AIR HYGIENE) (see next slide)




Airborne Transmission

 Virus may remain in the air for several hours if an infected person has been in a closed area

Therefore always wear a mask when entering a closed area, even if no-one else

is present

Ventilate indoor spaces

General Rules of Hygiene

- General rules of hygiene must be continued
- Handwashing / sanitising
- Maintaining social distance
- Cleaning surfaces
- MASKS
- AIR HYGIENE



New - Vaccination

- Rapid development and intensive testing of vaccines
- Vaccines are safe, with few adverse (mostly transient) reactions
- Rapid roll-out, generally starting with most vulnerable
- Uneven across different nations
- Not all are willing to accept vaccination; occasional medical exemption
- All vaccines are good; some lack data from fuller (Phase 3) trials



Vaccination is the way out of the pandemic

- Vaccines
 - effective in preventing severe disease (c. 90%)
 - reduce transmission of the virus by 50-60%
 - do not prevent infection / carriage of the virus
- If sufficient numbers are vaccinated
 - spread will be limited
 - development of mutants will also be limited
- Large variation between nations in vaccination rate

Tedros Ghebreyesus (WHO) – 'No-one is safe until we are all safe'



What can change?

- National and regional rules
- FIS Protocols
- The virus variants (mutations)
- Flexibility is essential



Variants

- Are often more infectious
- May escape neutralising antibodies (from previous infection or from vaccination)
- May cause more severe COVID-19 disease course
- Mutations/variants
 - currently, natural selection of viral mutants is based on infectiousness
 - in the future, may be based on escape from complete or incomplete immunity
- Delta.... -> 'Mu' variant (now found in 43 countries) may have higher vaccine resistance




SARS-CoV-2 variants in analyzed sequences, United Kingdom

Long Covid

Symptoms of Long Covid include:

- extreme tiredness (fatigue)
- shortness of breath, chest pain or tightness
- problems with memory and concentration ('brain fog')
- heart palpitations
- Dizziness, pins and needles
- joint pain
- depression and anxiety, difficulty sleeping (insomnia)
- tinnitus, earaches
- feeling sick, diarrhoea, stomach aches, loss of appetite
- a high temperature, cough, headaches, sore throat, changes to sense of smell or taste
- Rashes

May last weeks or months...



FIS Rules and Guidelines

- FIS rules and protocols are set to ensure the safety of all participants and of the nations they visit
- Global perspective
- Fair play, protecting others; asymptomatic transmission
- PCR test remains gold standard
 - Rapid antigen tests give many false positive and false negative results
- Isolation, contacts
- Honesty, responsibility
- Avoid spreading the virus to other countries
- Route to Beijing

FIS Protocols 2021-2022 — all TBC

- FIS passport continues; now includes vaccination status, and can upload from EU
 Green Pass
- Entry test, PCR within 72 hours of arrival
- If have a valid vaccination or if previously have had a proven infection (within the previous 6 months), no additional testing during the events longer than 72h
- Tests are likely to be required before departure from venue for next event, especially for cross-border travel
- Protocols and requirements for entry and ongoing testing are subject to national and regional rules
- Strong recommendation for VACCINATION



Prevention of Spread of Infection

- Wear masks when inside
- Keep your distance from other people
- Follow hygiene rules
- Get vaccinated
 - Vaccination protects the vaccinated individual
 - Vaccination breaks the infection chain (and therefore the spread of the virus)
- TOGETHER we can control the spread of SARS-CoV-2 by following the rules and getting vaccinated



The Vuokatti way

The main objective during the season 2020-21:

- " Ensure safe and healthy conditions for our clients and staff."
- "Convince and co-operate with regional health authorities in order to be able to "have door open"
- "Find solutions keep the business going."

Towards JWSC:

- Planning health & safety, sport & support activities, take an advantage of our facilities
- Execution and evaluation simultaneously, continuous communication with regional health authorities.
- Event task force a responsible LOC unit for leading the operations.



Athlete's path - arrival to Vuokatti

Requirements to enter Finland

- a member of NSA team, a proof of neg PCR test (<72h) / a proof of have had Covid disease earlier,
- an exact travel plan to Finland per team inc. where and when enter to Finland.
- relevant and updated information in FIS passport system
- Event task force: travel information 3 days before to Finnish Border Control.

Travel to Finland and arrival to Vuokatti.

- Instructions how to travel safety at plane, train, or in the bus.
- Designated bus to each team from the airport direct to the accommondation.
- Instructions about PCR test, meals
- Code of conduct for the first days
- Checked and updated rooming list a must



Covid-testing arrangements


- Staff, volunteers, officials, team members, drivers etc. ALL TESTED!
- 1 Feb 15 Feb Sport Resort for tested & accreditated persons only
- One test room 200 400 m from the hotels "one way in, another way out"
- Each team had their own test slot, 2 min / test, results asap to each team leader.
- Event task force -> shared pre-information on previous day to test staff (number of NSA/persons, testing schedule)
- Use & check of documents at FIS passport system or hard copies delivered -> avoid unnecessary testing
- Test staff: Guide, 2- 3 testing pairs, 2 persons collecting data, 1 person updating lists / sending SMS.
- Written test proofs delivered in 1 to 2 days to team leader.
- In case of a positive case:
 - PCR: isolation, tracing of possibly exposed team mates (regional health authorities- > event tasks force ->team leader >FIS-> LOC)
 - AG: a PCR-test-> isolation-> test result confirmed in app. 12-15 h -> further instructions





- Meal times based on competition and training programm.
- U 20 vs. U23
- Dinner with teammates at team cabinet. Limited dining time.
- Masks, hygienic, guidance.
- Meals for volunteers, staff, and officials served in another building.



Summary

- Total 1604 Covid19 tests , 4 positive.
- Our experiences of "a training bubble" in Oct-Dec -> a big help for planning JWSC operations
- Dining / restaurant arrangements challenging 60% more kitchen/restaurant staff needed.
- Event task force group (3 persons) operational management responsibility and direct links to various stakeholders.
 - 1st task: Clear focus for health & safety issues and co-operation within authorities
 - 2nd task: Share information and keep LOC & FIS & Staff & Teams updated.
- Good practises found: Manpower at stadium, online TCM arrangements etc.
