

## PREVIEW MEN'S SUPER-G BORMIO – Wednesday 29 Dec 2021

### Aleksander Aamodt Kilde

- Aleksander Aamodt Kilde won the two most recent super-G events held in the World Cup, the second race in Beaver Creek and in Val Gardena.
- The most recent man to claim three successive World Cup victories in the super-G was Kjetil Jansrud in December 2016 (Val d'Isère, Val Gardena, Santa Caterina).
- Dominik Paris was in 2018/19 (3) the last male skier to win more than two super-G events in a World Cup season.
- Kilde (4) is the male skier on most World Cup super-G wins since the start of 2020 (3 by Vincent Kriechmayr).
- The Norwegian won four of the last eight World Cup super-G events he started in. His other four results in this period were a fourth place, a 12th place and two DNFs.

### Marco Odermatt

- Marco Odermatt, leader in the overall and giant slalom standings, has won six World Cup events in 2021: four in the giant slalom and two in the super-G. The only Swiss man to claim more World Cup wins in a single calendar year is Pirmin Zurbriggen (9 in 1987).
- The most recent man to collect more than two World Cup super-G wins in a single calendar year was Kjetil Jansrud (4 in 2016). No Swiss man has ever won three World Cup super-G events in a calendar year.
- Odermatt finished in 24th place in the super-G in Val Gardena on 17 December, ending five successive World Cup podiums in this discipline.
- The last Swiss man to win a World Cup super-G on Italian snow was Beat Feuz in Val Gardena on 16 December 2011.

### Matthias Mayer

- Matthias Mayer leads the super-G standings after two second places (1st race Beaver Creek, Val Gardena) and a fourth place (2nd race Beaver Creek).
- Mayer is level with Hannes Reichelt (both 19) in seventh place on the men's list for most World Cup podiums in the super-G. Pirmin Zurbriggen and Didier Cuche (both 23) are in fifth place.
- Mayer claimed three World Cup wins in the super-G, most recently in Lake Louise on 1 December 2019.
- Of the five previous World Cup super-G events held in Bormio, three were won by Austrian skiers: Richard Kröll (1994/95), Hermann Maier (1999/2000) and Reichelt (2007/08).

## Other contenders

- **Vincent Kriechmayr** finished in the top-five in each of the last seven World Cup super-G events, including wins in Kitzbühel and Garmisch-Partenkirchen earlier this year. He finished second in last year's race in Bormio.
- The most recent Austrian man to achieve more than two World Cup super-G wins in a single calendar year was Stephan Eberharter (3 in 2002).
- Kriechmayr has claimed six World Cup victories in the men's super-G, second-most among active skiers behind Kjetil Jansrud (13).
- **Ryan Cochran-Siegle** won last season's super-G held in Bormio, on 29 December 2020. This marks USA's only men's World Cup super-G win in the last 15 years.
- **Travis Ganong** claimed a third place in the super-G in Beaver Creek held on 3 December. He could join Bode Miller (5), Daron Rahlves (3), Tommy Moe (1) and Cochran-Siegle (1) as only US men to win a super-G in the World Cup.
- After Bryce Bennett's win in the Val Gardena downhill on 18 December, United States could win a men's downhill and super-G event in a single World Cup season for the first time since 2006/07.
- **Beat Feuz** finished fourth in the super-G in Val Gardena on 17 December. The Swiss's most recent World Cup podium in this discipline was a third place in Kvitfjell on 3 March 2019. Feuz's last World Cup super-G win came in St. Moritz on 17 March 2016.
- **Dominik Paris** is the most recent Italian man to win a super-G in the World Cup when he won in Soldeu on 14 March 2019.
- The three Italian men to win a World Cup super-G event on Italian snow are Michael Mair (Madonna di Campiglio in 1982), Werner Heel (Val Gardena in 2008) and Paris (Bormio in 2018).
