

FIS Rules specific to the Alpine Events at the Olympic Winter Games 2022 in Beijing (CHN)

The Alpine Skiing competitions will be held in accordance with the 2021 edition of the International Ski Federation (FIS) International Ski Competition Rules (ICR), as approved at the online meeting in June 2021 and the precisions published on the FIS website, approved by the Council in Oberhofen November 2021.

Any questions or incident not covered by the rules will be handled as follows:

- cases of a general nature will be resolved in accordance with the Olympic Charter
- technical issues will be resolved by the Competition Jury in accordance with the FIS Rules.

ALLOCATION OF QUOTAS

Reference is made to the [IOC Qualification System](#) for the Olympic Winter Games, Beijing 2022, articles E. Confirmation Process for Quota Places and G. Qualifying Timeline.

On communication of the quotas by FIS to the NSAs and NOCs on 17th January 2022, it will be necessary for confirmation of the number of quota places accepted by the NOC and NSA by 24th January 2022 to be accompanied by the names of the athletes. This is to verify their eligibility and qualification.

The IOC has informed FIS that in the event an NOC does not enter the contingent of athletes at the Delegate Registration Meeting (DRM) which it has confirmed with the quota allocation, or it does not participate in the Games with the quota of athletes confirmed at the DRM, then it will take further action and potential sanctions. This prevails unless circumstances prevent a registered athlete to participate.

ENTRIES

Final competition entries

The final competition entries will be done online through the FIS Online Entry System. All responsible persons, confirmed by each NOC, can make the confirmation through the system. FIS will add all nominated athletes in the system as soon as get the final athletes nominations form IOC. The final competition entries must be done no later than three (3) hours before the Team Captains' meeting for the respective event.

Replacement

A replacement of the entered competitors by a NOC in case of injury or force majeure is only possible until one (1) hour before the Technical Meeting (Team Captains Meeting) for the respective event (for Downhill one (1) hour before the Technical meeting of the last Official training), based on the admitted quota for the NOC concerned and in line with the IOC Beijing 2022 [Late Replacement Policy](#). In such a case, the replaced competitor will have to return the accreditation before the replacement competitor can be accredited.

TRAINING AND COMPETITION

Prohibition of training

As from 10 days before the first official training for the Olympic Winter Games first event which is 3rd February 2022 no training shall be allowed on OWG courses - irrespective of the event and courses. In case of an infringement of this rule, the competitors concerned shall automatically be disqualified, or not allowed to participate.

Number of participants and Qualification for Downhill and Alpine Combined and both Trainings

2 additional competitors are allowed to participate in the official training for Downhill and the Downhill run of the Alpine Combined.

In case training counts for both events, DH and Alpine Combined, 4 + 2 competitors may participate for each event (max. 12 competitors). If training is held for 1 event (DH or AC) 4 + 2 competitors may participate in training (max. 6).

These additional competitors for training must fulfill the minimum requirement of a maximum of 80 Olympic FIS points in Downhill.

Athletes participating in Alpine Combined must have a maximum of 80 Olympic FIS points in Downhill.

In Alpine Combined if athletes are qualified to participate in World Cup Alpine Combined they are eligible and qualified for the event at the Olympic Winter Game.

STARTING ORDER

Enrollment

The best 30 competitors

The best 30 competitors present are enrolled according to the actual WCSL in the given event (quota adjusted), in case of a tie, according to FIS points in the given event. Those competitors, whose actual total number of WCSL points (sum of DH, SL, GS, SG, AC of OWG / WSC and World Cup) is at least 500, follow after the 1st group according to their WCSL event points (in case of a tie according to FIS points), if they are classified within the first 30 competitors present on the WCSL in the actual event.

Enrollment after the 30th competitor

Competitors with at least 500 WCSL overall points, who do not fulfill the above requirements, are enrolled after the 30th competitor (starting order according to the event WCSL, if not available, then according to FIS points).

Thereafter the competitors are enrolled according to FIS points (in case of a tie according to WCSL event points).

Those competitors who are classified in positions 31 - 35 of the valid WCSL in the event, will be enrolled after 45 according to their FIS points, if they are not ranked in the best 45 competitors present.

If there are less than 30 competitors with WCSL points in the given event, they will be enrolled first, followed by the other competitors according to FIS points in the given event. Competitors with at least 500 WCSL overall points will be in this case enrolled in the most favorable position (considering 500 WCSL (after 30th) rules or FIS points).

Starting order for SL, GS and AC (if 1st run = SL)

GS / SL: 1st group (1 - 15)

The best seven (7) competitors will be drawn between start numbers 1 – 7 and the remaining competitors between 8 - 15. This will take place by double draw. The double draw may be done electronically.

Starting list for DH, SG and AC (if 1st run = DH or SG)

The best ten (10) competitors present (quota adjusted) of the corresponding event WCSL choose their bibs between 1 and 19 odd numbered bibs only. The available even numbered bibs between 2 and 20 will be drawn between the next 10 competitors on the board (11 to 20). Bibs between 21 and 30 will be drawn between the next 10 competitors on the board (21 to 30). Thereafter the enrollment is made according to art. 9.1.2 of the WC rules.

Starting list for DH Training

The best ten (10) competitors present of the corresponding event WCSL will be drawn between 1 and 19 odd numbered bibs only.

Starting order 2nd runs Giant Slalom, Slalom and Alpine Combined

All competitors who complete the 1st run correctly have the right to start in the 2nd run. After confirming the start list of the second (there is no moving up to the top 30), the maximum best 30 competitors of the 1st run start in the reversed order of the times achieved in the 1st run, followed by competitors according to their times of the 1st run (31st, 32nd, etc.).

Mixed Team Parallel Rules

Eligibility of the Teams

The maximum number of Nations allowed to participate in the Mixed Team Parallel event is 16. If the host nation is not in the first 15 nations, it is qualified as the 16th nation. The first 15 nations on the World Cup Nations Cup standings as of 17th January 2022 will be eligible to enter a team with a minimum of two (2) male and two (2) female athletes in the Mixed Team Parallel event. This standing has to use to know which nations are automatically qualified. to the Olympic Winter Games Beijing 2022

For the enrolment the overall World Cup Nations Cup standing after the last World Cup race will be used.

Transponders

Transponders delivering live and recorded data that are provided by the official timing and data provider and approved by FIS must be worn by the competitors in competitions and official trainings.

Transponders deliver external data from competitors such as speed and positioning. Competitors that are not wearing the transponder, for other than technical reasons specified by the provider, will be sanctioned.
