

## PREVIEW WOMEN'S SUPER-G COURCHEVEL – Thursday 17 Mar 2022

### Italy

- **Federica Brignone** has already secured the crystal globe in the women's super-G this World Cup season. It marked Italy first crystal globe win in the women's super-G.
- With **Elena Curtoni** and **Sofia Goggia** currently in respectively second and third place, Italy can become the first country to sweep the women's super-G World Cup standings.
- Italy has claimed six victories in the women's super-G in the 2021/22 World Cup season. Only Austria (6 in 2004/05) ever recorded as many wins in a single season in the women's super-G.
- Brignone (3) could equal the record number of super-G wins by a female skier in a single World Cup season: four by Katja Seizinger (1997/98), Renate Götschl (2006/07), Lindsey Vonn (2008/09 to 2011/12, 2014/15) and Lara Gut-Behrami (2013/14, 2020/21).
- Goggia has won two super-G events this World Cup season. Multiple women could claim at least three World Cup super-G wins in a single season for the first time.
- Goggia recorded one super-G victory at the World Cup Finals, in Åre in 2018.

### Lara Gut-Behrami

- Lara Gut-Behrami is level with Renate Götschl (both 17) in second place on the women's list for most World Cup super-G wins, behind Lindsey Vonn (28).
- Gut-Behrami has won one super-G World Cup event this season, in St. Moritz on 11 December. She can win multiple super-G World Cup events in back-to-back seasons for the first time (4 in 2020/21).
- Gut-Behrami claimed one super-G victory at the World Cup Finals, in Lenzerheide in 2014. She also won the downhill at those World Cup Finals.

### Other contenders

- The race for the women's overall crystal globe can be decided in this race. **Mikaela Shiffrin** and **Petra Vihová** came into the World Cup Finals as the main contenders.
- Shiffrin (3) could become the third woman to win the overall crystal globe more than three times, after Annemarie Moser-Pröll (6) and Lindsey Vonn (4).
- This season, Shiffrin claimed three World Cup super-G podiums: second in Lenzerheide (5 March) and two third places in St. Moritz (11 and 12 December). Vihová's super-G results in this World Cup season were 18th places in Zauchensee and Lenzerheide.
- **Romane Miradoli** recorded her first World Cup victory in the most recent super-G event, in Lenzerheide on 5 March. It was France's first women's World Cup super-G victory since Carole Montillet-Carles's triumph in Haus im Ennstal on 1 February 2004.

- The most recent French woman to claim a World Cup super-G victory on French snow is Montillet-Carles, who won in Val d'Isère on 13 December 2002.
- **Tamara Tippler** (9) is the alpine skier, male or female, to have collected the most World Cup super-G podiums without ever winning. Tippler recorded two super-G podium finishes this World Cup season, a second place in Cortina d'Ampezzo on 23 January and a third place in Garmisch-Partenkirchen on 30 January.
- **Ragnhild Mowinckel** claimed one super-G podium finish this World Cup season, a second place in Val d'Isère on 19 December. The only Norwegian winners of a super-G in the women's World Cup are Merete Fjeldavlie (Vail, 1992) and Ingeborg Helen Marken (Kvitfjell, 1996).
