

## PREVIEW WOMEN'S SLALOM KILLINGTON – Sunday 27 Nov 2022

### Mikaela Shiffrin

- Mikaela Shiffrin won the first two slalom events of this World Cup season in Levi last week. She won the first three slalom World Cups in 2017 (first 4), 2019 (first 5) and 2020 (first 3).
- Shiffrin (49 wins in slalom) can become the first alpine skier to win 50 World Cup events in a specific discipline. Her 49 wins in the slalom is already a record (Ingemar Stenmark won 46 World Cups in the men's giant slalom).
- Shiffrin has won all five women's World Cup slalom events in Killington. After last week's double win in Levi, Shiffrin has only won more slalom World Cups in Levi (6) than in Killington (5).
- The other female skiers to have won at least six World Cup wins in a specific event at a single resort are: Lindsey Vonn (14 downhill in Lake Louise, 6 downhill in Cortina d'Ampezzo, 6 super-G in Cortina d'Ampezzo) and Annemarie Moser-Pröll (7 downhill in Pfronten).

### Petra Vlhová

- Petra Vlhová won the slalom crystal globe last season for the second time in her career, after 2019/20.
- Vlhová has won 17 slalom World Cups, joint-sixth among women alongside Anja Pärson (17). Janica Kostelic is fifth all-time on 20 wins.
- Vlhová finished second behind Shiffrin in each of the last four slalom World Cups in Killington. The only woman to have recorded five second-place finishes in a discipline at the same venue is Renate Götschl (5) in the downhill in Cortina d'Ampezzo.

### Other contenders

- **Katharina Liensberger** has claimed three World Cup victories in the women's slalom. The four Austrian women to have claimed more than three World Cup slalom victories are Marlies Schild (35), Roswitha Steiner (8), Gertrud Gabl (5) and Nicole Hosp (5).
- **Lena Dürr** recorded four podium finishes in the women's World Cup slalom last season, her first podium finishes in the event. The last German woman to win a slalom World Cup was Maria Höfl-Riesch who won in Levi on 10 November 2012.
- **Wendy Holdener** has recorded 30 podium finishes in the women's slalom in the World Cup without recording a win (2nd 15x & 3rd 15x). It marks the most World Cup podium finishes in a single event without a win by an alpine skier in a single discipline.
- Only one woman has finished second in a World Cup slalom event as many times as Holdener (15): Frida Hansdotter (17). Holdener's 15 third places in this discipline are already most for a woman in a specific event. This includes two third-places in the Killington slalom (2016, 2021).



- The last Swiss winner of a women's slalom World Cup was Michelle Gisin in Semmering on 29 December 2020.
- **Anna Swenn-Larsson** claimed six World Cup slalom podiums, but has yet to record her first win. Sweden's most recent slalom victory in the World Cup was achieved by Frida Hansdotter in Flachau on 10 January 2017.
