

PREVIEW WOMEN'S SUPER G LAKE LOUISE – Sunday 4 Dec 2022

Italy

- **Federica Brignone** won the crystal globe in the women's super-G last season. It marked Italy's first crystal globe win in the women's super-G.
- In the past 10 seasons, only one woman won the super-G crystal globe in back-to-back seasons: Tina Weirather in 2016/17 and 2017/18.
- **Elena Curtoni** finished second in the super-G standings last World Cup season.
- **Sofia Goggia** won two World Cup super-G events last season, including the opening super-G event in Lake Louise on 5 December 2021.
- Besides Goggia (2021), two other Italian women have won the Lake Louise super-G in the World Cup: Karen Putzer (2002) and Nadia Fanchini (2008).
- Last season, six of the nine women's World Cup super-G events were won by Italian skiers, including a shared win by Brignone and Cornelia Hütter in Garmisch-Partenkirchen.

Lara Gut-Behrami

- Coming into Lake Louise, Lara Gut-Behrami (35) was ninth in the all-time women's list for most World Cup victories, one behind Katja Seizinger (36) in eighth place.
- Gut-Behrami is level with Renate Götschl (both 17) in second place on the women's list for most World Cup super-G wins, behind Lindsey Vonn (28).
- Of Gut-Behrami's 17 super-G wins in the World Cup, three were achieved in Lake Louise (2013, 2014, 2016). Only Vonn (4) won the Lake Louise super-G more often in the women's World Cup.

Other contenders

- **Ragnhild Mowinckel** won the most recent women's World Cup super-G event, in Courchevel on 17 March 2022. It was Norway's third win in a women's super-G World Cup event, after victories by Merete Fjeldavlie (Vail, 1992) and Ingeborg Helen Marken (Kvitfjell, 1996).
- Last season, **Romane Miradoli** recorded her first World Cup victory in the super-G event in Lenzerheide on 5 March 2022.
- **Cornelia Hütter** won the last women's World Cup super-G event in which she participated, a shared win with Federica Brignone in Garmisch-Partenkirchen. Hütter missed last season's final two women's World Cup super-G events due to a concussion.
- **Tamara Tippler** (9) is the alpine skier, male or female, to have collected the most World Cup super-G podiums without ever winning.
